24 Jr., as part time 32 hour employee for DPW.

25 MR. BURKE: I'll second that.

1 MR. VERRASTRO: That's a temporary
2 position, correct?

3 MR. HALLINAN: Correct.

4 MR. MCHALE: We have a motion and a
5 second. On the question.

6 MR. DEMPSEY: On the question, do we
7 need to worry, Tommy, and maybe this is a
8 question for you about with the new health
9 insurance rules with working however many hours
10 a week?

17 consultant review.

12 on nonagenda items.

13 MR. MCHALE: Anybody like to address
14 Council tonight, please come up and state your
15 name for the record. And if we can, try to
16 keep it to a five minute --

17 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Starting with
18 Lackawanna County representative.

19 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Hetman, do you
20 want to start us off?

21 MR. HETMAN: Sure. Good evening as
22 you always, Council, Gerard Hetman from
23 Lackawanna County's Community Relation's
24 Department. Excuse me, first, it's good to see
25 you in the new year. Congratulations to the

1 four members sworn in tonight. Three returning
2 members have seen me quite a bit and Mr. Amico
3 I think has seen me in the last couple months
4 too.

5 Many of you know what I do. For the
6 general public and for the record, our
7 department provides constituent relations and
8 conducts community outreach on behalf of the
9 Lackawanna County Commissioners. So I'm your
10 one stop quick way to all services under the
11 county government.

12 Every month I alternate between the
13 first and second meetings. I have to cover a
14 couple different meetings on that second and
15 fourth Monday. But I'm here typically every
16 month. So what we do is bring updates and
17 announcements again from various county
18 departments, offices, and agencies. Some of
19 them are conducted by our department
20 specifically.

21 We do a health fair for seniors in
22 the fall and also public safety fair for kids
23 in April normally. We've done a job fair in
24 June that's been very successful. And we add
25 other ones an adjustment as we go according to

1 public feedback and public need as we identify
2 it.

3 So this month we just have one item
4 in particular. It comes from Penn State
5 Extension office in Lackawanna County. They do
6 many programs throughout the year especially
7 early on that deal with either agriculture or
8 commercial and private gardening and growing
9 and also personal health and wellness and
10 physical fitness.

11 They would like to announce them now
12 and start them in the spring so that people can
13 roll out gardening and physical fitness
14 attributes for the warm weather months. So
15 this month they call it -- the current is
16 January 21st. It's a Thursday. They call it
17 the Northeast Vegetable Meeting.

18 It's for people who grow vegetables
19 commercially in Lackawanna County and
20 surrounding areas. I don't know if we have
21 anyone here in the room tonight that does that
22 particular type of work. We still like to
23 announce it for the public anyway.

24 We'll leave the information for
25 Council and for anyone who would like to

1 attend. It takes place at the Newton Ransom
2 Fire Company. There's a \$26 registration fee
3 in advance or \$36 at the door. It includes a
4 buffet lunch.

5 And many of the programs provided by
6 Penn State Extension, many cases they are free.
7 Sometimes there is a nominal registration fee.
8 We find that the feedback we get the return is
9 very high. People participate for the
10 gardening, agriculture aspect whether it's a
11 health and wellness program they get a very
12 good return on the investment, enjoy the
13 program, many people participate year after
14 year.

15 So we'll announce a couple more of
16 these as the months go on, especially at the
17 start of the year, these are some of the first
18 things that come up for us. So that's all I
19 have for this evening.

20 MS. SCRIMALLI: What is the date on
21 that?

22 MR. HETMAN: It's Thursday, January
23 21st. It starts at 9 a.m. and ends at 3 p.m.

24 MS. SCRIMALLI: Thank you.

25 MR. HETMAN: Just for the record,

1 I'm always here through the meeting. And I
2 always try to stick around for a few minutes
3 afterward so if anyone has a question or
4 concern they are more than welcome to talk to
5 me.

6 And even if it's not a county
7 problem or issue, we'll always be happy to
8 direct you to the appropriate agency or entity
9 to address your issue and work with you to make
10 sure that you get an answer and hopefully get
11 it resolved in a timely fashion. That's all we
12 have. Thank you folks.

13 ALL MEMBERS: Thank you.

14 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Duncan.

15 MR. DUNCAN: Gary Duncan, 117 Barton
16 Street. Congratulations to the new officers of
17 the -- newly elect Council members and happy
18 new year to everybody. Just a few things as
19 always, did everybody get a copy of the minutes
20 from the last neighborhood watch? There was
21 10 new issues. I'm not going to go through
22 them tonight but just so everybody's got their
23 copy of it, we can talk about it.

24 Our next meeting is a week tonight.
25 So January 18th in this room, 7 p.m. We were

1 lucky -- fortunate our last meeting that we had
2 William McCarthy who is the Director of the
3 Lackawanna County Probation and Parole office
4 in attendance at our meeting. And he promised
5 us at that meeting that going forward he would
6 have a member of probation and parole office
7 come to our meetings. So that will be a nice
8 addition to it.

9 And I just want to thank the Council
10 members who were in attendance at the last
11 meeting, Hallinan and McHale. We appreciate
12 the fact that you folks come out and also to
13 School Director Kranick for just -- I have to
14 say for your continuing assistance with
15 everything and coming to all of those meetings,
16 it's much appreciated.

17 So everybody that is here tonight
18 and certainly all the guests that are here
19 tonight, we hope to see you all next week at
20 our neighborhood watch meeting. It would be
21 great to have you all here. Thank you very
22 much.

23 ALL MEMBERS: Thank you.

24 MR. MCHALE: Thanks, Gary. Anybody
25 else like to address Council tonight?

1 (No response.)

2 MR. MCHALE: Last chance.

3 (No response.)

4 MR. MCHALE: Seeing none.

5 ATTY. CUMMINGS: Public officials.

6 MR. MCHALE: Mrs. Scrimalli, do you
7 want to start us off tonight?

8 MS. SCRIMALLI: Yes. Thank you.
9 I'd like to congratulate our newest member of
10 our team here Mr. Vince Amico. And I'd also
11 like to congratulate our fellow officers that
12 have just been sworn in. I do want to also
13 thank firemen and the police department on
14 their wonderful job. We had a horrific
15 accident on the top of Drinker Street.

16 So with the work that was done
17 together between the fire department and the
18 police department, it just made it go smooth as
19 far as it could. But it was very sad and, you
20 know, it was very horrific. So thanks for your
21 service. Didge, I guess we're ready for a
22 little bit of snow that's coming?

23 MR. JUDGE: A little bit.

24 MS. SCRIMALLI: I'm hoping, right?
25 And I want to thank everyone for coming and

1 Happy New Year to everyone.

2 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Burke.

3 MR. BURKE: Congratulations to Sal,
4 Mike, Mike, and Vince. And that's it. Happy
5 New Year everybody.

6 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Verrastro.

7 MR. VERRASTRO: Yeah, Vince,
8 congratulations --

9 MR. AMICO: Thank you.

10 MR. VERRASTRO: And good luck. And
11 I look forward to working with everybody that's
12 here new term or existing. I have a picture I
13 guess this was left here tonight finally of our
14 new Quint fire ladder truck -- is that the way
15 I'm supposed to say that guys -- truck 6.

16 I don't know if the public had any
17 pictures of it. But it's our newest addition.
18 I'll let them get up and maybe -- one of them
19 can get up and come to the podium and give us a
20 brief description of what's going on with it
21 real quick being that we're very close to
22 getting.

23 I guess it's going to land here any
24 day from what I hear if you want to get up real
25 quick, Bob, maybe please -- Assistant Chief

1 Bobby Dee.

2 MR. DEE: We had our trip last week
3 out to Wisconsin to Pierce. I was in contact
4 with Mike a few times. Thank you with your
5 response with that. We did a three day
6 inspection out there and everything went well,
7 a few minor adjustments that we expected
8 basically that goes on with any truck.

9 They are doing the work. They
10 actually started the work the day before we
11 left even as we were going over the apparatus
12 pointing out little things here and there.
13 They were already working on the truck. We're
14 hoping our rep Bud Strauss from Glick, he's
15 tentatively factoring maybe the end of this
16 coming week it would be shipping hopefully from
17 Pierce.

18 It will go to the Lehigh Valley area
19 out to Glick to our local representative. They
20 will service it out there again. We'll go back
21 out with them. I invited Mike to go down if he
22 wanted to, anybody that actually -- we're going
23 to bring a bunch of our equipment down, kind of
24 retrofit it into the truck. And as soon as
25 they finish minor work down there, hopefully

1 get it back this way.

2 But it's a great looking piece.

3 Thank you very much. Do you have any
4 questions?

5 MR. VERRASTRO: It's everything you
6 looked at. That's what you wanted. You're
7 happy with it? It's going to fit on the
8 streets. We're good?

9 MR. DEE: Hopefully. Parking is a
10 problem sometimes but, no, like I said, the
11 demo we had we took all over town even up into
12 the Bunker Hill area because we do have a
13 height restriction on the bridge going down Ash
14 Street. It's only 11 feet and even the current
15 ladder truck we have now wouldn't fit under
16 there.

17 So to get up towards St. Roco's and
18 that, we're going to have to go to Bunker Hill
19 and that. And we did take apparatus up through
20 there and we didn't have a problem. Like I
21 said, hopefully parkingwise people will give us
22 a little bit of a break.

23 MR. MCHALE: Bobby, I wanted to on
24 behalf of Council, yes, we approved it; and
25 it's a million dollar piece that I think all

1 seven of us up here are extremely proud and
2 can't wait to see.

3 I want to thank all of your
4 firefighters for the input that they and
5 especially your committee who put in personal
6 time -- a ton of personnel time to get this
7 from a sketch that we sat in the police
8 department conference room about a year ago to
9 fruition today.

10 And, I mean, it's an unbelievable
11 piece and everybody sees the price tag of this,
12 but, you know, when a struggling Borough would
13 like to put on 15 more firefighters and
14 unfortunately I don't think anybody could
15 afford that, to have a piece of equipment like
16 this where at least the minimum guys that we
17 can get out there until the troops come
18 running, have everything they need on one truck
19 and really anything that can happen you're
20 ready for it.

21 I think we're proud of both you and
22 us. But again, I want to thank you and your
23 guys for the hard work. They went out to
24 Wisconsin and worked 12 hours a day just to go
25 through every nut and bolt on this car -- this

1 truck. As you could see if anybody wants to
2 see, they have a picture here. It's going to
3 be pretty impressive looking.

4 But just the operations of it will
5 make our department much more efficient and
6 effective for any structure or anything. Any
7 extraction, any accident that may happen to
8 make our great firefighters even better to have
9 this.

10 So it's a proud day for us when this
11 comes in. And I want to thank you personally.
12 I know you and I spoke quite a bit last week
13 out at the factory, but to bring this you guys
14 got to be very proud to actually have this
15 accomplishment and it's a proud day for us.

16 MR. DEE: Thank you. Anybody that
17 wants to see the process you could actually go
18 on Facebook if you're a member, just Fans of
19 Dunmore Fire Department. The whole build
20 process from the very first pictures we have
21 been posting all along trying to keep Council
22 and everybody informed. So thank you for the
23 opportunity.

24 MR. MCHALE: You guys will have I
25 assume when the weather gets better to have an

1 open house to show everybody this
2 spectacular --

3 MR. DEE: Hopefully we can try to do
4 a combination between the new addition on the
5 building, the back garage that was just redone,
6 and the new truck. Maybe we can do an open
7 house and have like a little cook out or
8 something for everybody to come down, tour the
9 facility, see the apparatus. Anytime anybody
10 wants to come down you don't have to wait for
11 it. Once it's here, come and see it if you
12 want to.

13 MR. MCHALE: Absolutely.

14 MR. DEE: Thanks, guys.

15 MR. DEMPSEY: Thanks, Bobby.

16 MR. MCHALE: Thanks, Bobby.

17 MR. HALLINAN: Thank you.

18 MR. VERRASTRO: Other than that, I
19 just want to thank you guys. I know those
20 trips out there, most of it was on your own
21 time. We just basically carried the expenses
22 for them to get out there, paid their hotel
23 room and plane tickets.

24 MR. MCHALE: That was actually part
25 of the agreement.

1 MR. VERRASTRO: Yes. That is what
2 we negotiated. Thank you very much and have a
3 good night. Thanks for coming, everybody.

4 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Amico.

5 MR. AMICO: I just want to thank
6 everybody on Council for being so gracious to
7 me and your congratulations tonight means a lot
8 to me. And I look forward to serving the
9 people of Dunmore and hope I could serve with
10 honor and integrity. So thank you very much.

11 MR. MCHALE: Mr. Hallinan.

12 MR. HALLINAN: Congratulations to
13 Vince, to the other Councilmen that were
14 elected tonight -- to your positions as
15 President and Vice President. Also like all
16 the EMS and especially what we saw the other
17 day with a gentleman terrorist run to a police
18 care and just shoot somebody, and you keep
19 thinking it can't happen in Dunmore.

20 I'm just so proud that our guys
21 are -- the things that they do every day, our
22 emergency workers, our firemen, our DPW guys.
23 A lot of people don't see what you do until we
24 need you. But I just want to make sure I give
25 you credit every time I see you. Thank you

1 guys. And that's all I have. Thank you.

2 MR. MCHALE: Attorney Dempsey.

3 MR. DEMPSEY: Again, congratulations
4 to everybody. Vince, I look forward to working
5 with you and always Michael and Sal. For those
6 of you who may not know, we -- all seven of us
7 agreed -- we assigned a full-time uniform
8 police officer at the Dunmore School District.

9 There's obviously nothing more
10 important than the safety of our children. So
11 we are in a financial position now to help the
12 school district as much as we could even this
13 little bit helps them with the budget concerns
14 that obviously not just them but all school
15 districts have.

16 So we're pretty proud of that that
17 we were able to do that and help out the school
18 district and have a uniform -- I think it's
19 Captain Springer down there all day full time.
20 So I just wanted to mention that for those of
21 you who may not know. Other than that, thanks
22 for coming. And I look forward to another four
23 years.

24 MR. MCHALE: Four years. I don't
25 have anything other than congratulations to

1 Vince and everybody who was sworn in tonight.
2 Vince, I look forward -- I've know Vince for a
3 long time. I look forward to working with him.
4 And I think -- I was going to speak on the fire
5 truck. We did that. So I think that's all I
6 have. We'll look for a motion to adjourn.

7 MR. DEMPSEY: I make that motion.

8 MR. MCHALE: Do I have a second?

9 MR. HALLINAN: I'll second it.

10 MR. MCHALE: All in favor signify by
11 saying aye.

12 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

13 MR. MCHALE: We're adjourned.
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
