We have a 17 positive for the first month of \$25,000, which I think it's better to look at the 18 19 profit and loss and then the change. 20 Like, total income it looks like for 21 the first month we're down \$418,000 from the 22 prior year; is that correct? 23 MR. RUGGIERO: That's what it looks 24 like. 25 MS. BRIER: We're only down 39,000

from the prior year on expenses. So just as a 1 trending situation, we're -- we -- it's not a 2 3 good trend when our revenue is down and our 4 expenses aren't down at a commensurate level. 5 So it's just something to keep an eye on for now. Vito, some of these larger 6 7 line items like miscellaneous revenue 8 \$167,000, do we know where that's from? 9 MR. RUGGIERO: I would have to talk 10 to Mr. Burton. 11 MS. BRIER: Okay. Maybe we can talk 12 about that. 13 MR. DEMPSEY: I think at least the 14 special assessments one, the landfill --MS. BRIER: Yeah, that's the 15 16 landfill. Yeah, I knew that. And that's down 17 across the board. Yeah, and that's down for 2020 as well. So the other one is the Tax 18 19 Anticipation Note. I thought we got that. 20 MR. RUGGIERO: We did get it. It's 21 a line of credit. It's not in the general 22 fund. 23 MS. BRIER: Then the 2020 was the 24 same thing. That probably shouldn't be in 25 there then.

MR. RUGGIERO: Correct. 1 MS. BRIER: The 2020, because if it 2 3 was the same exact thing then, you know, either 4 we put it in or we take 2020 out because this 5 is not a good comparison. MR. RUGGIERO: I will talk to 6 7 Mr. Burton about that. 8 MS. BRIER: Okay. So that's a 9 hundred grand of that 418. So that's good. 10 You know, it's 318. 11 MR. DEMPSEY: That's good --12 MS. BRIER: It's better than 418. 13 But it's not a good -- it's not a good trend. 14 Anyway, that's all. Anybody have any questions 15 on that? 16 MR. RUGGIERO: Number seven, public 17 comment. 18 MR. testing, did confirm today that they are more than willing to help scope this work and do the work for the Borough if it's acceptable to them. I provided the information like two hours ago to Vito.

I had a conference call with the tester earlier today. It's up to you guys how to handle it. I don't know if there's a bid or not for professional services or things like that. But Vito has all the information now for the guy that ran the first round of testing.

In my e-mail to you all last week I think it was, we also got some results on additional chemical tests they were running.

I'm not qualified to speak on the results of it other than they said, yeah, this warrants testing as well.

So my goal here is to get the Vito the information for contact. I'm not an engineer. That guy will help scope this out and figure out what the best course of action is in terms of what should be tested for, how often and where and what the cost would be.

MR. BRIER: We don't have any cost estimates yet?

1 MR. CLARK: No, I didn't ask them. I wanted you guys -- I'm trying to get out of 2 3 the middleman there for the Borough in terms of 4 any conflict there. But I'm happy to answer 5 any questions anyone has about that? Sometimes my e-mails I know are a little bit lengthy. 6 7 MR. DEMPSEY: I think we're good. 8 Does anybody have any question for Pat? 9 (No response.) 10 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you. 11 MR. CLARK: Thank you. 12 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Pat. 13 MR.
