4 MR. RUGGIERO: Mrs. McDonald

5 Zangardi.

6 MS. ZANGARDI: Here.

7 MR. RUGGIERO: Mrs. Scrimalli.

9 MR. RUGGIERO: Mr. Ehnot.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: Seeing none.

1 MR. RUGGIERO: Number four, a motion
2 to approve the minutes.

3 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll look for a
4 motion.

5 MR. HALLINAN: I'll make that
6 motion.

7 MR. DEMPSEY: Do I have a second?

8 MR. EHNOT: Second.

9 MR. DEMPSEY: I have a motion and a
10 second. Anyone on the question?

11 (No response.)

12 MR. DEMPSEY: All those in favor
13 signify by saying aye.

14 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

15 MR. DEMPSEY: Opposed?

16 (No response.)

17 MR. DEMPSEY: The ayes have it and
18 so moved.

19 MR. RUGGIERO: Number five is a
20 motion to approve and pay the open bills.

21 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll look for a
22 motion.

23 MS. ZANGARDI: I'll make that
24 motion.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: Do I have a second?

1 MR. EHNOT: I'll second it.

2 MR. DEMPSEY: I have a motion and a
3 second. Does anyone have anything on the
4 question about any of the unpaid bills?

5 (No response.)

6 MR. DEMPSEY: Hearing none. All
7 those in favor?

8 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

9 MR. DEMPSEY: The ayes have it and
10 so moved.

11 MR. RUGGIERO: Number six, motion
12 authorizing the enactment by the Council of the
13 Borough of Dunmore of an ordinance authorizing
14 the issuance of one or more series of taxable
15 and/or tax-exempt general obligation bonds of
16 the Borough for the purpose of funding a
17 project which consists of financing,
18 refinancing and/or reimbursing any area or all
19 of the following:

20 Number one, refunding the Borough's
21 outstanding general obligation notes Series of
22 2012.

23 Number two, refunding the Borough's
24 outstanding general obligation note Series of
25 2015.

1 Number three, refunding the
2 Borough's first outstanding general obligation
3 note Series A of 2016.

4 Number four, refunding the Borough's
5 second outstanding general obligation note
6 Series A of 2016.

7 Number five, refunding the Borough's
8 outstanding general obligation note Series B of
9 2016.

10 Number six, refunding the Borough's
11 outstanding general obligation note Series of
12 2017.

13 Number seven, refunding the
14 Borough's outstanding general obligation note
15 Series of 2018.

16 And eight, paying the cost and
17 expenses of issuance of all of the bonds all as
18 more fully described in the complete text of
19 the ordinance.

20 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll look for a
21 motion.

22 MR. EHNOT: I'll make a motion.

23 MR. DEMPSEY: Do I have a second?

24 MR. AMICO: I'll second it.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: Anyone on the

1 question?

2 MS. SCRIMALLI: Yes, on the
3 question, now this is specific to a certain
4 company that we are dealing with as far as
5 refinancing?

6 MR. DEMPSEY: As far as I know
7 it's --

8 ATTY. PERRY: Boenning and
9 Scattergood.

10 MS. SCRIMALLI: Okay. I just
11 mentioned this because while I feel it's very
12 important to try to get these funds as far as,
13 you know, refinancing them; I think it's a
14 great idea. And I appreciate all the work that
15 was being done doing this to get those
16 refinanced.

17 But it's going to be taking 12
18 million dollars out of Dunmore and bringing it
19 into another location such as Philadelphia
20 where this other company is from. So I just
21 wanted to make sure that everyone was aware of
22 that and, you know, just kind of let you know
23 where I stand on that. And that's all I have
24 to say on that.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you, Mrs.

1 Scrimalli.

2 MS. SCRIMALLI: You're welcome.

3 MR. DEMPSEY: Anyone else on the
4 question?

5 (No response.)

6 MR. DEMPSEY: Okay. All those in
7 favor? Let's do a roll call.

8 MR. RUGGIERO: Mrs. McDonald
9 Zangardi.

10 MS. ZANGARDI: Yes.

11 MR. RUGGIERO: Mrs. Scrimalli.

12 MS. SCRIMALLI: No.

13 MR. RUGGIERO: Mr. Ehnot.

14 MR. EHNOT: Yes.

15 MR. RUGGIERO: Mr. Dempsey.

16 MR. DEMPSEY: I have to abstain.

17 MR. RUGGIERO: Mr. Hallinan.

18 MR. HALLINAN: Yes.

19 MR. RUGGIERO: Mr. Amico.

20 MR. AMICO: Yes.

21 MR. RUGGIERO: Four yeses, one no,
22 and one abstain.

23 MR. DEMPSEY: And let me just
24 explain -- I'll just explain my abstaining on
25 the record. I've already explained it I think

1 in two public meetings.

2 But I do have a family member that's
3 employed by Boenning -- what is it, Mick?

4 ATTY. PERRY: Boenning and
5 Scattergood.

6 MR. DEMPSEY: So I did not
7 participate in any of the votes that took
8 place. I forget what meeting it was. I did
9 explain that I did abstain. I did explain my
10 reasons why. And I'm just doing it now on this
11 vote just again for the record purposes. So
12 that passed.

13 MR. RUGGIERO: So that would be
14 4-1-1.

15 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you.

16 MR. RUGGIERO: Number seven is the
17 Treasurer/financial report, Borough Treasurer
18 Mark Burton.

19 MR. BURTON: Good evening Council.
20 I have just a brief analysis of February's
21 numbers. The bottom line we're through the
22 month of February. We're short a net income of
23 200 -- approximately \$276,000.

24 February was a very solid month as
25 far as collecting real estate taxes which it

1 normally is. And through the first week in
2 March we're also seeing an uptick in
3 collections which is a positive sign.

4 There was no draw on the TAN so far
5 for this -- the first two months of the year.
6 Interest income has been reduced a bit because
7 of the draw on the Sewer Authority money from
8 last year. So that number is down a little
9 bit.

10 And landfill fees are down a little
11 bit from prior year. As far as expenses are
12 concerned, we had a large down payment on our
13 insurances for the auto liability, general
14 liability property. That came out in February.
15 That was \$114,000. And we also made a \$40,000
16 partial payment to the MMO for 2021.

17 And as far as the actual -- the
18 budget numbers, again, there was no draw on the
19 TAN. It was budgeted for \$150,000 for the
20 first two months. But we didn't need it. So
21 we didn't take a draw on the TAN.

22 Landfill fees were a little bit
23 lower than anticipated. That's as far as the
24 revenues. Expense-wise, police salaries were
25 up just a little bit.

1 Maintenance snow and ice removal
2 with the snowfall in February we had to
3 purchase additional rock salt to replenish our
4 stock. And again, the insurance premiums were
5 a little bit higher than budgeted. We didn't
6 have a solid number before the budget came out.
7 And that's about all that -- up to this point.

8 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you, Mark.

9 MR. HALLINAN: Thank you, Mark.

10 MR. RUGGIERO: Number eight, public
11 comment.

12 MR. DEMPSEY: Would anyone like to
13 address Council tonight? Please state your
14 name and address for the record.

15 MS. MEDINA: Can I take this?

16 MR. DEMPSEY: Sure.

17 MS. MEDINA: My name is Crystal
18 Medina. I am here on behalf of Third Street
19 which is about two blocks over from here.
20 We've had numerous incidents over the last few
21 years. I've been here four years. And I
22 probably had about seven incidents on my street
23 to me alone with car break-ins, four of them
24 since I've been here.

25 Three have been in the last year

1 with everybody on our street. The most recent
2 was just several weeks ago where it was parked
3 in the driveway, the perpetrator went into the
4 vehicle, stole her wallet. It was found down
5 in the alley.

6 We've had -- I've had my son's bike
7 stolen off the front porch brand new right from
8 preschool graduation right off my front porch
9 next to my front door just a few feet from
10 where he sleeps. This has been detrimental to
11 our family and the rest of the families on
12 Third Street because prior to this, this has
13 been a very beautiful neighborhood. Everybody
14 loves and wants to live in Dunmore.

15 But it has been very concerning for
16 us on Third Street. I am myself along with the
17 others we have small kids. They like to be out
18 to play at night. And, you know, 6:00, 7:00 it
19 starts getting a little bit darker out. And we
20 have no light on our street.

21 Our neighbors have had property
22 destroyed as far as decorations are concerned,
23 things stolen from their front yards. I know
24 myself and a couple of other neighbors have
25 also invested money into cameras. But with the

1 street being as dark as it is, the cameras are
2 not picking up what's going on because it is so
3 dark in the evenings.

4 And these streets that are next to
5 us, you know, Fourth Street, Fifth Street,
6 Sixth, they have a light that's going halfway
7 down their block. And we're here to request to
8 have a light installed halfway down our street
9 to help deter -- hopefully to deter a
10 perpetrator coming down our street. We're
11 being targeted because it's so dark.

12 MR. DEMPSEY: What block?

13 MS. MEDINA: This would be Third
14 Street, yes, the 500 block.

15 MS. ZANGARDI: Right off Dudley
16 Street -- between Meade and Dudley, right?

17 MS. MEDINA: Yes. Yep. It's
18 going up Dudley it's the second street on the
19 right. I don't know that the other end of
20 Third is having an issue. I'm not sure on
21 that. I'm just discussing our side of Third
22 Street there on the 500 block.

23 And I'm here on behalf of everyone.
24 We have a close-knit family on our little
25 street there. But, I mean, when you have your

1 six year old waking up in the middle of the
2 night scared that someone is breaking into the
3 house or is going to steal his bike or steal
4 his truck, he's still waiting for Dunmore
5 Police to return his bike.

6 You know, and it's really a sad
7 situation because we do love to be there. And
8 clearly this is an ongoing issue.

9 I see through the Ring cameras that
10 there are issues in other parts of town as
11 well. But for some reason, Third Street itself
12 I believe is being targeted. I've had pretzels
13 stuffed in my gas tank. I had coffee spilled
14 on my car -- poured right onto my car.

15 Just this past summer we've had two
16 of our neighbor's girls nine years old were
17 around the block and a black SUV came up and
18 was basically stalking them. Three days later
19 my niece in broad daylight a block right
20 here -- a block from the police station came
21 running to me -- my house to tell me that
22 someone was trying to kidnap her because the
23 same description SUV was rolling up on her who
24 is 16 years old was walking to Turkey Hill to
25 get a lollipop with her friend.

1 Now, the cops were involved and as
2 far as I know there has been no other sightings
3 of this particular vehicle. And there has not
4 been any leads as far as I'm aware of. But
5 clearly this is a problem.

6 MR. DEMPSEY: Is there an existing
7 pole there?

8 MS. MEDINA: Pardon?

9 MR. DEMPSEY: Is there an existing
10 pole?

11 MS. MEDINA: There is an existing
12 pole there.

13 MR. DEMPSEY: Would you happen to
14 have the number on the pole?

15 MS. MEDINA: 514.

16 MR. HALLINAN: On the pole itself.

17 MS. MEDINA: On the telephone pole
18 itself, I do not.

19 MR. HALLINAN: What's your exact
20 address? I'll go later.

21 MS. MEDINA: I am 515 Third Street.
22 And it's directly across. You'll see
23 there's -- there's only one driveway and it's
24 right there. So actually if you were to put
25 the light up it would shine into my house.

1 MR. HALLINAN: After the meeting I'm
2 going to go take a look. I'll get the pole
3 number.

4 MR. DEMPSEY: We have lights.

5 MR. MEDINA: Okay. Thank you very
6 much. I do have a letter from another resident
7 if you would like or if that -- or if this will
8 satisfy if you want to pass it around or if you
9 want me to read it I'd be happy to.

10 MR. DEMPSEY: I think we're all okay
11 with getting you a light.

12 MS. MEDINA: Okay.

13 MR. DEMPSEY: Quit while you're
14 ahead.

15 MS. MEDINA: All right. You got it.
16 Thank you very much for your time.

17 MR. EHNOT: Tim, can you just ask
18 the cops to patrol that a little bit more often
19 for them just to drive by it?

20 MAYOR BURKE: Oh, yeah, no, they're
21 aware of the situation, Tom, yeah. But
22 Crystal's right. There -- it is -- on the
23 other blocks going all the way up Dudley on
24 that side of the street, there is street lights
25 in the middle of the block. And it is very

1 dark there. I mean, I know. I grew up right
2 there. And I walk --

3 MS. MEDINA: I live in his house.

4 MAYOR BURKE: She lives in my old
5 house.

6 MR. HALLINAN: I know where you're
7 at.

8 MAYOR BURKE: It's very dark in that
9 area. And there's a lot of children there.
10 And that's one of the reasons I have the cops
11 going through there more often than usual in
12 other neighborhoods. But the lighting
13 situation in that area is pretty bad.

14 But it's across the street from
15 Crystal's house, there's a house for sale. The
16 pole is right there right in the middle of the
17 block. That would be the perfect spot.

18 MR. HALLINAN: Timmy, I'll meet you
19 up there after and we'll get the pole number.
20 The only question I have is again, all the
21 neighbors are on board because what happens is,
22 you put a light in then you'll hear from other
23 neighbors saying this light is shining in my
24 house. Why did you put a light in, you know?

25 So I hear your problem. I'm with

1 you. I just want to make sure all the
2 neighbors are on board.

3 MS. MEDINA: That they are.

4 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you. The only
5 issue that we've always had is getting PPL to
6 turn it on. So once we get the light
7 installed, it may take some time for them to
8 turn it on just so you're aware. We did have
9 that issue before.

10 So if there's a time issue, it's
11 normally PP&L just doesn't act quickly
12 normally.

13 MS. MEDINA: Okay. Well, we're
14 hoping that it would be in by at least
15 summertime because, you know, the kids do like
16 to play. I mean, the youngest is seven. And
17 they are all about 9, 10, and 11 years old.
18 And they play in the street in front of the
19 house.

20 I mean, we're very appreciative of
21 the stop sign that's been put up. We're very
22 appreciative of that if we could just get the
23 people to stop at that stop sign, that would be
24 glorious.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: If you could figure

1 that out, please let us know.

2 MS. MEDINA: I know. I know. We're
3 working on it. We're working on it. We've got
4 the team moms on Third Street working on that
5 too. But I would appreciate that because, you
6 know, we have been having just this ongoing
7 problem.

8 And it's becoming nerve-racking at
9 this point, you know, I come home from work
10 late at night and I'm looking at my
11 surroundings in front of my own house to make
12 sure I could safely get out of my car. You
13 know, because I don't know who's there. You
14 can't see, you know? So thank you again
15 everyone.

16 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you.

17 MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you.

18 MR. DEMPSEY: Anyone -- please. If
19 you could state your name just for the record,
20 please?

21 MS. YODER: My name is Diane Yoder.
22 I'm with the Jarett Yoder Foundation. My
23 address is 124 Kutz Road, Fleetwood, PA 19522.

24 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you.

25 MS. YODER: I'm here with Eric

1 Darling from Valhalla. I am the one that's
2 buying Marywood South. I just wanted to come
3 and introduce myself and explain -- I sent all
4 of you invitations. I don't know if you got
5 it.

6 MR. DEMPSEY: We just got them
7 today. Thank you.

8 MS. YODER: Oh, really. Well,
9 you're welcome to come.

10 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you.

11 MS. YODER: The adjutant general is
12 coming -- the top general in Pennsylvania is
13 coming. And we have other dignitaries coming
14 too. And the ribbon cutting is a ceremony of a
15 rebirth of the facility.

16 We're going to be giving tours kind
17 of explaining what we're going to do. It's a
18 lot of work. It's going to take us a couple
19 years. But we're trying to make a central
20 place where veterans and community heros could
21 get assistance if they need.

22 Right now we've been running about
23 seven years. My son Jarett was killed in
24 Afghanistan in 2013. I still have two children
25 that serve actively. So we all live together

1 because the deployments are hard on the family.

2 We house 425 veterans and community
3 heros at this time throughout the eastern part
4 of Pennsylvania in nine counties. We were
5 asked by Eric to come look at this property and
6 see if we could work together.

7 We agreed. We worked with Marywood.
8 We're going to be opening others. But we have
9 a lot of dignitaries that are coming tomorrow
10 to see what we're doing because we're planning
11 on purchasing other properties and doing this.

12 So we are going to be opening up to
13 the community, what do they want to see done
14 there. A lot of the suggestions that we've
15 gotten, we're going to be running out of room
16 already. But we are open for suggestions
17 because it's going to be a community area. And
18 we'll be working with you and we'll make sure
19 we follow all the laws.

20 I'm a former fire marshal. We will
21 follow the laws and make sure that we get our
22 permits. You have my promise with that.
23 Safety is number one.

24 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you.

25 MS. YODER: Any questions on

1 anything?

2 MR. DEMPSEY: I'm sorry, I didn't
3 look at the invitation yet. What time is it
4 tomorrow?

5 MS. YODER: 12:00. And there will
6 be a light lunch. You'll never starve with a
7 Yoder around. Thank you.

8 MR. DEMPSEY: I never starve anyway.

9 MR. HALLINAN: Thank you.

10 MS. SCRIMALLI: Thank you and
11 welcome.

12 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you so much.

13 MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you.

14 MR. DEMPSEY: Would anyone else like
15 to address Council tonight? Yes, sir. Just
16 state your name and address for the record,
17 please.

18 MR. MARTIN: My name is Patrick
19 Martin. And I just got a quick comment. I
20 live on Andrew Street in Dunmore which is only
21 two blocks long. And my block never gets
22 plowed. With snow gone I know it's a little
23 late in the season now.

24 But when we got like that 32 inches,
25 my neighbor on his ATV with a plow in front

1 plowed the road. And, I mean, that doesn't --
2 it helped. But, you know, when it was like 30
3 inches it doesn't help that much.

4 But it's just -- it never seems to
5 get plowed. This last snowstorm it got plowed.
6 They went up it once and they came down it
7 once. But it's still. It like snowed on top
8 of what they plowed basically. So that's all.
9 That's my concern is just the 100 block of
10 Andrew Street.

11 MR. DEMPSEY: My father-in-law lives
12 on that street. I'm surprised he didn't call
13 screaming at me. I'll make sure it does get
14 plowed, 100 block of Andrew.

15 MR. HALLINAN: I think I spoke to
16 you about this already. I'm sorry, I missed
17 your message.

18 MR. MARTIN: No, I figured it out.
19 That's all right. But in addition to that,
20 this is just a comment just based on driving.
21 Apple Street which one runs all the way across
22 Dunmore, they tore it up for like I think they
23 were working on pipes or something below it.
24 But it is terrible now.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: I'm on it --

1 MR. MARTIN: It's like a war zone.

2 MR. DEMPSEY: I do drive there.

3 It's one of the worst roads in the Borough.

4 MR. MARTIN: I don't know if you can
5 look into getting that paved or something. I
6 mean, there are holes --

7 MR. DEMPSEY: It's part of a water
8 company project. It's going to be paved. It's
9 going to be paved curb to curb. I think that's
10 on there, right, Vito?

11 MR. RUGGIERO: It is. The Sewer
12 Authority changed all those mains going through
13 there. They're going to pave that curb to curb
14 when they're done.

15 MR. MARTIN: I know they were
16 working on it like crazy and then the snow hit
17 and everything. And I know it kind of went
18 away.

19 MR. RUGGIERO: They promised us in
20 the spring.

21 MAYOR BURKE: Thursday's meeting we
22 brought it up.

23 MR. MARTIN: I'm sure you get it all
24 the time because I come down it because I park
25 going down Andrew Street. So it's just

1 terrible. But that's all, just the plowing.
2 Thank you.

3 MR. DEMPSEY: Would anyone else like
4 to address Council tonight?

5 (No response.)

6 MR. DEMPSEY: Seeing none.

7 MR. RUGGIERO: Number eight, public
8 officials.

9 MR. DEMPSEY: Mayor Burke.

10 MR. RUGGIERO: Nine, sorry. I
11 called it eight.

12 MR. DEMPSEY: Mayor Burke?

13 MAYOR BURKE: Yes, I'd like to thank
14 you for putting your program into Dunmore and
15 wish you good luck. Anything we could do, you
16 know, it's great that you could help the
17 veterans out. I think that's really admirable.
18 And thank you. You could call us anytime at
19 the Borough for any kind of help or anything.

20 We just got your invitation an hour
21 ago in Executive Session. But anything we
22 could do, just give us a ring.

23 MS. YODER: Sorry that they came out
24 late. We only had a seven-day window. So I'm
25 sorry it wasn't earlier.

1 MAYOR BURKE: But I wish you the
2 best of luck and what you're doing is a great
3 thing. And also, I want to thank the coaches
4 from Dunmore and all the sports. It was a
5 tough season the last two years for all the
6 hard work and the students. It's a really hard
7 time for student athletes and any kind of
8 organizations in the Borough.

9 I feel sorry for the families and
10 the kids. I'd like to thank the teachers and
11 the coaches for hanging in there with our
12 students. They are doing a good job. That's
13 all I have tonight.

14 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you, Mayor
15 Burke. Mark, do you have anything?

16 MR. BURTON: No.

17 MR. DEMPSEY: Vito?

18 MR. RUGGIERO: Nothing.

19 MR. DEMPSEY: Chief DeNaples?

20 CHIEF DENAPLES: We got another
21 shipment of Red Cross smoke detectors in. So
22 if anybody knows anybody that needs them, we'll
23 come out and install them, any Borough
24 residents.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you, Chief.

1 Vito, do you have anything?

2 MR. RUGGIERO: Nothing.

3 MR. DEMPSEY: Didge?

4 MR. JUDGE: No.

5 MR. DEMPSEY: Anybody else?

6 ATTY. PERRY: I have nothing.

7 MR. DEMPSEY: Mrs. Zangardi?

8 MS. ZANGARDI: No, I'm good. Thank
9 you.

10 MR. DEMPSEY: Mrs. Scrimalli?

11 MS. SCRIMALLI: Yes, I do. The
12 Scranton Abington Planning Association will
13 hold a public hearing on April 12th. This is
14 regarding updating our zoning ordinances. And
15 it will be an online meeting.

16 I would also like to thank
17 Mr. DeNaples and Keystone Landfill for lending
18 our Borough a garbage truck at no charge while
19 our truck was being repaired. And I do want to
20 thank Didge and the DPW for a great job, not
21 only salting and plowing the roads during the
22 ice storm and the snow events that ended up
23 cancelling our last meeting, but I also want to
24 thank you guys for continuing to pick up the
25 garbage all throughout the snowstorms because I

1 understand other towns were having large
2 trouble getting their garbage picked up. So
3 thank you for that. And that's all I have.
4 Thank you.

5 MR. DEMPSEY: Thank you,
6 Mrs. Scrimalli. Mr. Ehnot?

7 MR. EHNOT: I just want to thank
8 Mrs. Yoder, thank your family for serving our
9 country; and I wish you the best of luck.

10 MR. DEMPSEY: Mr. Hallinan?

11 MR. HALLINAN: Again, I'd like to
12 echo Mr. Ehnot. Thank you for doing what you
13 are doing over at Marywood. And I thank you
14 for everything that you are doing for the
15 community and thank you for your service for
16 your family.

17 Didge, thanks for the snow removal,
18 unbelievable season, busy February. Now, if we
19 get some potholes patched, my phone doesn't
20 stop ringing, okay, and I keep bugging you.

21 And I'd like to -- Vito, when this
22 money I hope comes from the COVID Relief Fund
23 that was just passed that we get something for
24 the boroughs because they're saying there's
25 money going to be in there for the local

1 communities.

2 So I hope somehow we get some kind
3 of relief there. And I just want to wish
4 everybody a happy St. Patrick's Day. I know
5 I'll be celebrating. Thank you. That's all.

6 MR. DEMPSEY: Thanks, Mr. Hallinan.
7 Mr. Amico?

8 MR. AMICO: I was just basically
9 going to say the same thing. Mrs. Yoder
10 welcome to the community. I'm thrilled that
11 Marywood is being revitalized. And I could
12 think of no better way to use that property
13 than to service the veterans.

14 I live right around -- right around
15 the corner, actually across the street from it.
16 And it's going to be a great, great part of our
17 community. So again, I'm super thrilled that
18 you are here. Thank you once again. Thank
19 you.

20 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll echo what these
21 guys said. Thank you so much. And we look
22 forward to working with you guys. And
23 hopefully at least some of us could make it to
24 your event tomorrow afternoon. I will try my
25 best to get there.

1 But welcome to the community. And
2 hopefully we'll have a great working
3 relationship and a nice future there.

4 Regarding the potholes the -- Didge,
5 they do have two crews out every single day
6 patching. And we do know they're out there so
7 just so you guys are aware there are two crews
8 out every single day.

9 You know, we have to get the garbage
10 and recycling and everything else that they are
11 doing. But there are crews out there doing
12 that. That's all I have. So with that, I will
13 look for a motion to adjourn.

14 MS. SCRIMALLI: I'll make that
15 motion.

16 MR. DEMPSEY: Do I have a second?

17 MR. HALLINAN: I'll second it.

18 MR. DEMPSEY: I have a motion and a
19 second. All those in favor?

20 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

21 MR. DEMPSEY: Opposed?

22 (No response.)

23 MR. DEMPSEY: The ayes have it and
24 so moved. We're adjourned.
