13	Whereas Dunmore Borough desires to
14	approve Dunmore Borough Bucktown Music Fest and
15	whereas the applicant desires to apply to the
16	County of Lackawanna for Community reinvest
17	grant for the purpose of carrying out this
18	project. So obviously the Music Fest at the
19	corners. It's for a grant Councilman Hallinan
20	has been handling.
21	MR. DEMPSEY: I'll make that motion.

11	MR. AMICO: Ayes have it. Have it.
12	MR. WOLFF: Number eight, motion to
13	approve the Stormwater Location Kit for DPW.
14	MR. AMICO: I'll look for a motion
15	to approve the Stormwater Location Kit for the
16	DPW.
17	MS. ZANGARDI: I'll make that
18	motion.
19	MR. AMICO: I have a motion. Do I
20	have a second?
21	MR. O'MALLEY: I'll second.

23	earlier, this is just another tool for our DPW
24	to have. Right now the borough does we do
25	have some stormwater lines that are our

1	responsibility.
2	And this allows for our DPW to mark
3	the lines and to locate the lines and mark
4	the lines when any digging is going to be
5	taking place. It's just, you know, another
6	tool that they're going to have in their
7	arsenal.
8	MS. BRIER: Do you know how much it
9	is?
10	MR. AMICO: Eight thousand.
11	MS. BRIER: Oh, we talked about
12	that.
13	MS. OVEN: And that includes
14	training for it.
15	MR. AMICO: That in which includes
16	the training, correct.
17	MS. BRIER: Thank you.
18	MR. AMICO: I have a motion and a
19	second. We talked about on the question. All
20	those in favor.
21	ALL MEMBERS: Aye.
22	MR. AMICO: Opposed?
23	(No response.)
24	MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.
25	MR. WOLFF: Number nine, Treasurer

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1	financial report. Mark.
2	MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council.
3	It's a relatively quiet month of January as
4	expected. Tax bills went out in the beginning
5	of February. So we have light collections as
6	far as revenues are concerned. Net income for
7	the month was \$404,000.
8	Obviously year-to-date net income is
9	\$404,000. Miscellaneous revenue we had
10	received \$100,000 from Dunmore School District
11	for 2022-23 SRO fee. They paid it all in one
12	lump sum. Special assessments was 771,000 for
13	the fourth quarter of 2022 landfill fees.
14	And we did have to access the TAN
15	\$200,000 for the first payroll of the year. On
16	the expense side, \$17,000 in rock salt and
17	other 11,000 DPW repairs and \$30,000 insurance
18	premium quarterly for auto and liability
19	coverage for the first that is the first of
20	four installments.
21	MS. BRIER: So, Mark, we didn't have
22	to take money from the Sewer Authority money
23	for the first payroll because we used the TAN.
24	MR. BURTON: We used the TAN.
25	MS. BRIER: Is that correct?

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1	MR. BURTON: Correct. And we'll be
2	able to pay that back hopefully the end of this
3	month, if not in the beginning of March.
4	MS. BRIER: Oh, good.
5	MR. BURTON: It was just that first
6	payroll came before we received the landfill
7	fees. So we needed that to fund the first
8	payroll.
9	MS. BRIER: That's why it's
10	temporary.
11	MR. BURTON: Correct.
12	MS. BRIER: I just want to say
13	thanks for coming in. I know it's your day
14	off.
15	MR. BURTON: No problem. Thank you.
16	MS. OVEN: Thanks.
17	MR. DEMPSEY: Thanks, Mark.
18	MR. O'MALLEY: Thanks, Mark.
19	MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you, Mark.
20	MR. WOLFF: Mr. Kearney.
21	MR. KEARNEY: Hi. The last several
22	weeks have seen a continuation of our weekend
23	party rentals as well as the basketball. This
24	past week we hosted an all star tournament for
25	various area teams and as well as Dunmore teams

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1	with the conclusion scheduled this Friday
2	night. They had to cancel some games
3	yesterday.
4	Moving forward we're into the last
5	several weeks of the Biddy season. There will
6	be a concluding all star tournament the first
7	weekend of March. The following weekend,
8	Saturday, March 11th, we are hosting a spring
9	celebration by the Indian community which
10	amazingly is the same day as the parade day so
11	a lot of people will be doing stuff that day.
12	Looking ahead, we have rented the
13	courts to Riverfront for eight consecutive
14	Thursdays starting in March. Their AAU is so
15	big that they get an overflow. We've been
16	doing it for the past several years. And we've
17	also had our first meetings with the Jog for
18	Jude people, which will be held here Saturday,
19	April 22nd.
20	That's going to be the same thing
21	that they did last year where it was a Saturday
22	evening. Apparently, there's going to be a
23	band this year. I don't know if the fireworks
24	are going to go off because there was a little
25	bit of an incident last year. But I'm not

2	We just had the first meetings last
3	week. But they scheduled a bunch of meetings
4	and I'll keep you up-to-date with that. But
5	other than that, that's all I have.
6	MS. BRIER: Chris, we talked about
7	the pickleball court.
8	MR. KEARNEY: Yes. Max called me
9	last week I think at some point. And the one
10	thing I explained to him is when you had talked
11	to me I went in and did measurements on the
12	Court. And the volleyball that we already have
13	down there is apparently the exact dimension of
14	pickleball. So we wouldn't have to
15	MS. BRIER: The net you mean?
16	MR. KEARNEY: Yeah, I mean, it's
17	like a 60 feet by the box so you wouldn't
18	have to put anything on the floor. It's really
19	not we're really not supposed to put tape on
20	the floor because when you pull it up it peels
21	the top part off. So I think, you know,
22	wherever you are getting it I guess you said
23	Chris Lowe, if they want to come and I told
24	you give them my number.
25	They could come down and look at it

12 1 because regulation pickleball courts are the 2 same as volleyball. The only thing is there's 3 one part in pickleball --4 MS. BRIER: The kitchen they call 5 it. MR. KEARNEY: Yeah, you're not 6 7 But I supposed to go too close to the net. 8 think that line is there for volleyball also. 9 MAYOR CONWAY: You said March 5th 10 they're done with Biddy? 11 MR. KEARNEY: March 5th is the last 12 Biddy day. And then that week, the Thursday 13 night we have Riverfront. And then Saturday we 14 have the Indian people here. And then after 15 that it's -- we're clear except for Thursday 16 nights. 17 MS. BRIER: Chris, can you please 18 look into how much it would cost to buy the net 19 or even two nets? 20 MR. KEARNEY: It depends on what kind of net you want. You could get like I 21 22 would think you would want something sturdy. 23 So it looked like it was a couple hundred 24 dollars. 25 MR. DEMPSEY: We could run down to

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1	Battaglia's and talk to Sharon. She usually
2	gives us good deals on everything.
3	MR. KEARNEY: You could get like
4	have you ever seen the badminton things you put
5	up in your back yard and you hit it once and it
6	falls down, that's how that thing you could
7	get a cheap one like that or if you're going to
8	get people that are playing there a lot you're
9	better off getting something sturdy.
10	MS. BRIER: Okay.
11	MS. OVEN: If you were to measure
12	the other one out, would it be two pickleball
13	courts?
14	MR. KEARNEY: We can only we only
15	have markings on one court. That last court is
16	basically a multipurpose thing. We have a
17	batting cage up there. We have the volleyball
18	area set up. So if we're going to do anything
19	besides basketball, that's where we would do
20	it.
21	MS. OVEN: But if you were going to
22	make lines on the other one, would it be a
23	second full one or no?
24	MR. KEARNEY: You would have to
25	yeah, it's the same size court but there's no

14 1 lines on it. So if you wanted two courts going at the same time, we'd have to mark the other 2 3 one. And, I mean, I'm sure there's a way to do 4 it but I don't know. 5 MS. OVEN: I just wasn't sure if that would be two, a total of two if we 6 utilized all the floor. 7 8 MS. BRIER: Then it would be three. 9 You could do three. MR. KEARNEY: 10 MS. BRIER: There's three basketball 11 courts. 12 MS. OVEN: Okay, thank you. 13 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Chris. 14 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge obviously not 15 He's still recovering. Chief Marchese, here. 16 Mayor, you said he got pulled away to 17 something. Chief DeNaples. 18 CHIEF DENAPLES: Good evening, 19 Council. Just have a few things on the Fire 20 Department report. As far as expenditures for 21 this month we only had a couple steep ones. We 22 had one set of backup gear for one of our 23 firefighters that we needed to get. 24 That was taken out of rescue 25 That was approximately \$4,500. billing.

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1	Again, that came out of the rescue billing
2	account. The only other big expenditure for
3	this month was the original service that was
4	supposed to be done in January that I mentioned
5	last month for ladder truck.
6	That's about 3,650. It was pushed
7	off to February. Just got a call on it today
8	it's pushed off until March 6th as a tentative
9	date. They're having some staffing issues.
10	There was some repairs done to the ladder truck
11	in the meantime that were needed. That will be
12	approximately \$1,200.
13	There's one that needs to be
14	finished. It will probably be finished
15	tomorrow or Wednesday at the latest, just some
16	minor repairs that added up over some time.
17	That's as far as expenditures. When this
18	report was originally written and sent to Vince
19	and Greg, it was on the first of February.
20	Originally there was going to be 16
21	hours of overtime scheduled in. One of our
22	other firefighters went off after this was
23	submitted. So we're scheduled for 84 hours of
24	overtime for February at this point barring
25	nothing else unexpected happens.

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1	Fifty-six part-time shifts were put
2	out. No other scheduled events for the Fire
3	Department at this point. As far as call
4	volume from February 1st to current was 25
5	total calls. That was as of when I left today
6	at 5:00.
7	One fire type call, emergency
8	medical services and rescue combined were
9	eight, hazardous materials were three, service
10	calls were seven. That's including smoke alarm
11	installations. We've done six of them so far.
12	We have another one scheduled for the end of
13	the week tentatively two good intent calls
14	and four false alarms. That's 25 total.
15	That's pretty much all I have for the Fire
16	Department side.
17	On the code enforcement side from
18	February 1st to current, a few of them items
19	were lingering over from January. There was
20	three reinspections done, one passed, two did
21	not. We have to go back for further
22	reinspections.
23	One was a cat complaint. The
24	individual said he was going to take care of it
25	and stop feeding them in that area. He agreed

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1	to do that. That was on Grove Street. One
2	other item, the person didn't show up. So
3	we're sending another letter out to try to
4	reschedule that particular inspection.
5	And the other initial inspection we
6	have to go back and do reinspections. There
7	are some permits that need to be pulled in
8	order for them repairs to be done before we go
9	back. So that's pretty much sums that up. If
10	there's no questions that's all I have for
11	tonight.
12	MS. OVEN: Just for the gentlemen on
13	Grove Street with the cat, did someone complain
14	that you had to send a fire
15	CHIEF DENAPLES: I actually went
16	over. This was on the code side.
17	MS. OVEN: This was that really cold
18	night?
19	CHIEF DENAPLES: What actually
20	happened is there was a crime stoppers
21	complaint that went in on the crime stopper
22	network. And that e-mail was forwarded to me
23	from the police department. So I went up there
24	and I spoke to the resident. He told me he's
25	feeding these cats for approximately a year.

18 1 He had plates all over his porch and his yard. He didn't lie about it. He told me 2 3 what he was doing. So I asked him to stop. He said he would immediately stop. He cleaned up 4 5 all the plates while I was there, threw them in the bag and took them in the house. 6 7 He did -- I did try to call Griffin 8 Pond, got a voicemail up there that the animal 9 control officer that works with them is on vacation and will return calls as in order of 10 the way they received them. I followed back up 11 12 and I have no return call. 13 MS. OVEN: They are inundated up 14 there. 15 MS. BRIER: How about our annual 16 control guy? 17 CHIEF DENAPLES: He will not deal 18 with cats I found out. I had another animal 19 control issue that I needed him to set traps. 20 He will not deal with any cats. I guess there 21 was an incident. He didn't get into it. 22 MS. BRIER: And then there is some 23 group -- another group that does this catch and 24 release thing. They spay them and clip their 25 ear or something. So you guys know that.

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1	CHIEF DENAPLES: If you have any
2	information you could forward it to me.
3	MS. OVEN: We're trying to get a
4	program started. It's hard to get someone
5	to they're so inundated
6	MS. BRIER: Yeah
7	MS. OVEN: and Nay Aug to see if
8	we can get someone to help with
9	CHIEF DENAPLES: Yeah, if you have
10	any now, I did call Comm Center too and see
11	if they had any other contact information for
12	Griffin Pond. The same number that I looked up
13	is the only number they have as well.
14	MS. OVEN: Thank you.
15	MS. BRIER: Chief, I just had a
16	quick question. What is good intent a good
17	intent call?
18	CHIEF DENAPLES: So a good intent
19	call is let's say we were dispatched for a
20	water leak or a car accident and we got there
21	and it wasn't really an incident so that would,
22	you know, it's not an unfounded call but it's a
23	call that we went out on and it wasn't what it
24	was dispatched as. And there's no live
25	threats.

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1	MS. BRIER: Okay, I see. Okay.
2	Thanks.
3	MR. DEMPSEY: Thanks, Chief.
4	MR. AMICO: Thanks, Chief.
5	MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you, Chief.
6	MR. O'MALLEY: Thank you, Chief.
7	MR. WOLFF: Public comment.
8	MR. AMICO: Would anyone from the
9	public like to comment this evening? You're
10	our public tonight.
11	MR. ZANGARDI: No, thank you.
12	MR. AMICO: Good to go? Fantastic.
13	MR. WOLFF: Number 12, public
14	officials.
15	MR. AMICO: Public officials,
16	Attorney Perry?
17	ATTY. PERRY: I have nothing.
18	MR. AMICO: Mayor Conway?
19	MAYOR CONWAY: I have nothing.
20	MR. AMICO: Let's start off, Miss
21	Oven?
22	MS. OVEN: I just want to say Happy
23	Valentine's Day to everybody and thank you for
24	coming to the meeting.
25	MR. AMICO: Mrs. Brier?

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1	MS. BRIER: Just Happy Valentine's
2	Day and again, thanks, Mark.
3	MR. AMICO: Miss Zangardi?
4	MS. ZANGARDI: I'm good. Thank you.
5	Happy Valentine's Day everyone.
6	MR. AMICO: And Mr. O'Malley.
7	MR. O'MALLEY: I failed to mention
8	this earlier, but, Mr. Wolff, I want to say
9	thank you so much for your hard work
10	negotiating the DPW contract. That's all I
11	have.
12	MR. AMICO: Mr. Wolff, I forgot to
13	ask if you have anything tonight. I apologize.
14	MR. WOLFF: The only thing I did
15	mention this you guys, texting or calling or
16	whatever, DPW is out cold patching whatever
17	they possibly can. We are going to hit that
18	Tiffany Drive. That's next on our priority
19	list. So they are coming in. We have a list
20	that we're knocking them off the best we can.
21	MS. BRIER: How about First Street
22	behind Ragnacci's? I know a woman told me that
23	she spoke to you about it awhile ago and you
24	said they're you couldn't cold patch then.
25	MR. WOLFF: Yeah, I think there was

1 still snow on the ground. You know what, I'll 2 follow up with that one. There was snow on the 3 ground that day. 4 MS. BRIER: Yeah, she said that. 5 It's right behind Ragnacci's. 6 MR. WOLFF: That was before. We had 7 a different list then. I'll follow up with 8 that. 9 MR. AMICO: Mr. Dempsey? 10 MR. AMICO: And I'm good to go. I 11 have nothing this evening.
