3 MR. WOLFF: Roll call, Mayor

4 Conway.

5 MAYOR CONWAY: Here.

6 MR. WOLFF: Mrs. Zangardi.

7 MS. ZANGARDI: Here.

8 MR. WOLFF: Mr. O'Malley.

9 MR. O'MALLEY: Here.

10 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Dempsey.

11 MR. DEMPSEY: I'm here.

12 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Amico.

14 MR. WOLFF: Mrs. Brier.

15 MS. BRIER: Here.

24 MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.

25 MR. WOLFF: Personnel matter,

1 appoint DPW member Sean Comstock as a truck
2 driver as classified in the collective
3 bargaining agreement.

4 MR. AMICO: I'll look for a motion
5 to appoint Sean Comstock as a truck driver as
6 classified in the contract.

7 MR. O'MALLEY: I'll make that
8 motion.

9 MR. AMICO: I have a motion. Do I
10 have a second?

11 MR. HALLINAN: I'll second it.

12 MR. AMICO: I have a motion and
13 second. Anyone on the question? Seeing none,
14 all those in favor.

15 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

16 MR. AMICO: Opposed?

17 (No response.)

18 MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.

19 MR. WOLFF: Personnel matters,
20 appoint Chris DeNaples as the Code Enforcement
21 Officer.

22 MR. AMICO: I'll look for a motion
23 to appoint Chief DeNaples as our Code
24 Enforcement Officer.

25 MS. ZANGARDI: I'll make that

1 motion.

2 MR. AMICO: I have a motion. Do I
3 have a second?

4 MS. BRIER: I'll second.

5 MR. AMICO: I have a motion and a
6 second. Anyone on the question? Just quick
7 heads up, we did table this at last month's
8 meeting. And, you know, I had some discussion
9 with Chief DeNaples. And it's on our agenda
10 tonight and we're going to vote on it.

11 So I just wanted to clarify that
12 last month it was tabled. Anyone else on the
13 question? All those in favor.

14 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

15 MR. AMICO: Opposed?

16 (No response.)

17 MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.

18 MR. WOLFF: Personnel matter,
19 appoint Robert Grunza and David Redmond as
20 full-time police officers pending civil service
21 test certification.

22 MR. AMICO: I'll look for a motion
23 to appoint Robert Grunza and David Redmond as
24 our next two full-time officers.

25 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll make it.

1 MS. OVEN: I'll second.

2 MR. AMICO: On the question?

3 MR. DEMPSEY: Yeah, a little bit on
4 the question, these two guys have been
5 part-time officers I don't know how long for at
6 least the last couple of years, right, Chief?
7 They work a ton of shifts and gotten us out of
8 a ton of jams. They work hard when they're
9 here.

10 I appreciate all that they do. I'm
11 so happy, you know, I'm hoping we get through
12 this and everybody votes in favor of hiring
13 them. They do a fantastic job. And I'm glad
14 we're able to reward their hard work with a
15 full-time job.

16 They're two young guys. So they're
17 going to be here for a long time. So I
18 appreciate your hard work. It's fitting on
19 National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day so
20 hopefully congratulations at the end but thank
21 you for all you do for our town.

22 MS. BRIER: Just for the record,
23 Maria, the test -- the certification should be
24 tomorrow; is that right?

25 MR. AMICO: Tomorrow.

1 MR. WOLFF: That's correct. They do
2 have a quorum. Everything should be online.

3 MS. BRIER: They do have a quorum.
4 Yeah, I'd just like to echo we're really
5 thrilled. I mean, we just see the work they
6 do. It's incredible. Thank you.

7 MR. O'MALLEY: I'd like to echo what
8 Mr. Dempsey and Mrs. Brier both said. These
9 guys are with us a few years. They work really
10 hard. I see them everywhere and so welcome
11 aboard and hopefully you're with us for a
12 really long time.

13 MAYOR CONWAY: Just from my
14 experience with these two guys since I've been
15 on for the last year, I see these guys in the
16 office pretty much every day. They are always
17 working weekends, holidays. You know, they are
18 out everywhere.

19 I've gotten tons of compliments on
20 these two. I'm really excited that they will
21 be part of the office full time. And again, I
22 can't have a stronger endorsement for these two
23 guys. I think they're great.

24 MR. AMICO: I'll just finish up by
25 saying, you know, it's easy again for me to

1 echo what everyone else says. I've heard
2 nothing but positive about you two gentlemen.
3 I'm very proud to be part of the group that
4 hopefully is going to approve your hire
5 tonight. So again, thank you for all you have
6 done and, you know, future thanks what you're
7 going to be doing for our borough. With that
8 said, anybody else?

9 MR. HALLINAN: I'd like to just
10 add -- echo everybody else's words. But also
11 to realize we have a few things in this borough
12 that we have to do and one of them is public
13 safety. And sometimes in my world, that's
14 foremost number one to protect the public.
15 That's what we're here for.

16 So thank you and I hope the vote
17 goes your way and thanks for sticking around
18 because I know it was touch and go for you guys
19 with other offers you had. I'm glad on you're
20 onboard. Thank you.

21 MR. AMICO: Anyone else? Seeing
22 none, all those in favor.

23 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

24 MR. AMICO: Opposed?

25 (No response.)

1 MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.

2 Congratulations, gentlemen.

3 MR. O'MALLEY: Congratulations.

4 MR. WOLFF: Number nine, approve the
5 purchase of two modular battery powers radar
6 signs with 11 inch display.

7 MR. AMICO: I'll look for a motion
8 to purchase two modular battery powered radar
9 signs with 11 inch display.

10 MR. O'MALLEY: I will make that
11 motion.

12 MR. HALLINAN: I'll second it.

13 MR. AMICO: I have a motion and a
14 second. On the question? Mr. O'Malley?

15 MR. O'MALLEY: On the question, I
16 reached out to Troop Borough and they highly
17 suggest the radar sign. I looked at another
18 company as well. And so this particular model
19 is a battery powered model. Each battery will
20 last give or take two weeks.

21 It comes with two batteries. And
22 one of the really nice things about it is that
23 it will provide weekly, daily, hourly, and half
24 hour data on the number of vehicles, number of
25 speeders, the average speed, peak speeds and

1 more.

2 So I'm hoping that -- and this model
3 too is fully movable. So I'm hoping every so
4 often we can move it throughout the borough.
5 The solar powered one isn't as moveable. They
6 said it would take a few men. It would take
7 over a half hour for a couple men to do it.

8 So this is a much easier situation
9 for us. And hopefully we could get a little
10 bit more of a handle on, you know, getting
11 people to drive more safely in the borough. So
12 a couple times a year I'm thinking we can
13 probably move it and we can work with the
14 police to figure out areas where they feel it
15 might be best needed. That's all.

16 MR. AMICO: Thanks, Mr. O'Malley.

17 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Trip, for -- you
18 put a lot of time and effort into this into
19 finding out the best solution for us. It's not
20 law enforcement but I think it will help law
21 enforcement. And, you know, you can let us
22 know what you think where it should go and hot
23 spots.

24 CHIEF MARCHESE: It will be a good
25 deterrent.

1 MR. AMICO: Anyone else? All those
2 in favor.

3 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

4 MR. AMICO: Opposed?

5 (No response.)

6 MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.

7 MR. WOLFF: Number 10, approve a
8 \$500 donation to Griffin Pond Animal Shelter.

9 MR. AMICO: I'll look for a motion
10 to approve a \$500 donation to Griffin Pond
11 Animal Shelter.

12 MS. OVEN: I'll make that motion.

13 MR. O'MALLEY: Second.

14 MR. AMICO: I have a motion and a
15 second. On the question?

16 MS. OVEN: Just on the question,
17 Griffin Pond just looks for donations at the
18 beginning of the year for municipalities and
19 boroughs that they help out with the animal
20 issues. So they've really been there for
21 Dunmore when we had issues with our animals so
22 we would like to support them when we can.

23 MR. DEMPSEY: Yeah, I mean, this
24 \$500 donation goes a long way when people bring
25 up animals, cats, spade, neuter, especially a

1 lot of Dunmore residents including our own
2 animal control when we bring them there. So
3 we're happy to give this donation to help them
4 out.

5 MR. AMICO: Anybody else? All those
6 in favor.

7 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

8 MR. AMICO: Opposed?

9 (No response.)

10 MR. AMICO: Ayes have it.

11 MR. WOLFF: Number 11, Treasurer
12 report. Mark.

13 MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council,
14 for the month of December we actually show a
15 net loss for the month of 1.4 million dollars.
16 I'll give you details why when I give the
17 expense review which brings our year-to-date
18 loss to a little over a million dollars.

19 Incomewise for the month of
20 December, again, tax revenues remain stagnant
21 95 percent collection rate. State and capital
22 operating grants, we received 5,000 from
23 Lackawanna County for the Music Fest.

24 And miscellaneous revenue, 145,000,
25 our second installment of our PMHIC surplus

1 distribution. And on the expense side
2 personnel and administrative benefits, we had
3 to make a \$154,000 down payment to our 2023
4 workmen's comp. Highway construction and
5 rebuild, \$901,000 paving project was paid in
6 the month of December.

7 And our retirement and pension
8 contribution 96,000, the final payment of the
9 MMO for 2022 year. Again with the large paving
10 project, we have a net loss of 1.4 million and
11 net loss for the year of 1 million dollars.

12 MR. AMICO: Anyone have any
13 questions for Mark?

14 MR. BURTON: Thank you.

15 MR. AMICO: Thanks, Mark.

16 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Mark.

17 MR. WOLFF: Chris Kearney.

18 MR. KEARNEY: This past week at the
19 DCC has seen a resumption of Bidy Basketball
20 after the two previous weekends being off
21 because of the holidays. They didn't play
22 between Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

23 So we're back -- we're right in the
24 heart of the Bidy season with practices and
25 clinics going on nightly during the week, games

1 on the weekends.

2 We resumed our party rentals this
3 past weekend but we were closed the previous
4 two weekends because of Christmas and New
5 Year's. And this weekend there's no parties in
6 here because Bidy is using the room for two
7 days. They take the pictures.

8 And moving forward we have another
9 seven to eight weeks of Bidy Basketball
10 activities here. That's pretty much our
11 busiest time of year. Any questions?

12 MR. AMICO: Thank you.

13 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Chris.

14 MR. KEARNEY: Thank you.

15 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge is still off.
16 Chief Marchese.

17 CHIEF MARCHESE: For the month of
18 December our department responded to 684 calls
19 for service. It's down by 179 calls for the
20 month. For the year of 2022 our department
21 responded to a total of 8964 calls. 2022
22 showed an increase of over 1,200 calls from the
23 previous year.

24 For the month of November, our
25 department made seven criminal arrests, eight

1 non traffic and seven traffic arrests. There
2 were 19 shifts given out for overtime. Officer
3 Richardson and Igoe completed the SRO training
4 from December 12th to the 16, which means they
5 will be a certified SRO in case something
6 happens at the school and we need another guy.
7 These two are both certified. They could go to
8 the school at any timeframe which helps us.

9 Christmas with the Cops was a
10 success. It resulted in over 50 children
11 receiving gifts, toys, clothes. It went over
12 very well. All the gifts this year were
13 donated from Dunmore residents and businesses.
14 We want to thank everybody for their support as
15 usual.

16 Appel Technologies has begun the
17 process of upgrading our computer. They are
18 still waiting on one or two things to come in.
19 Our body armor is in. And this week it was
20 distributed. So every officer has their new
21 body armor and will be wearing it.

22 And I would just like to thank
23 Council for putting these two on. They are --
24 they went above and beyond the last two years
25 to help us when we were in a jam. They worked

1 a lot of shifts. They are both good men and I
2 think they will be a big asset to our
3 department.

4 Oh, and also, we had an incident on
5 Friday, 812 Butler Street. Thank God no one
6 was hurt. We had a little incident with a man
7 threatening a lady with a knife. SWAT Team was
8 there. Neighborhood departments came.
9 Everybody works together. We got him out
10 without incident. He was arrested and
11 everything went well.

12 MS. BRIER: I saw that in the paper.
13 Chief, when you said you respond to 8,000
14 calls, what's the response?

15 CHIEF MARCHESE: Calls for service.
16 It could be a barking dog, could be an assault,
17 it could be accidents.

18 MS. BRIER: Do you have to go out?

19 CHIEF MARCHESE: Yes. They are all
20 calls we have to respond to.

21 MS. BRIER: When you say respond,
22 you're going out.

23 CHIEF MARCHESE: That doesn't
24 include phone calls or anything like that.
25 That's actual calls.

1 MS. BRIER: Okay, thanks.

2 MR. AMICO: Thanks, Chief.

3 MR. HALLINAN: Thank you.

4 MR. WOLFF: Chief DeNaples.

5 CHIEF DENAPLES: Good evening,
6 Council. Let's start out with expenditures
7 for the month of January. They were projected.
8 We only have a couple steep ones. We have the
9 annual preventative maintenance on the ladder
10 struck, pretty extended maintenance schedule on
11 it.

12 So that's set at \$3,650. That may
13 possibly get pushed to February because they
14 lost an employee that was supposed to come up
15 and do that. The only other steep expenditure
16 we have projected for this month is
17 approximately \$5,000 for a new set of turnout
18 gear for our newest full-time firefighter that
19 was hired I believe in November of '22.

20 So we waited until the first of the
21 year because he had some gear when was part
22 time for the new budget to purchase that. So
23 he will get fitted for tomorrow. As far as
24 overtime scheduled for this month, we have 204
25 hours.

1 We still have -- still down to 12
2 full-timers working. We still have a few guys
3 off. They've been off long-term. Besides for
4 that, we ended out the year of 2022 with 1,349
5 calls we responded to during that time period.

6 For the month of January, 2023, we
7 responded to 18 incidents so far. As far as
8 part-time shifts for this month January, 2022,
9 we have 48 scheduled. We're in the process of
10 orienting two new part-timers. One is out on
11 an injury. He didn't get hurt at work in
12 Dunmore. He got hurt on his personal time.

13 So he's unable to do any orientation
14 at this point until he gets medically cleared.
15 That is pretty much all I have at this point.

16 ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Chief.

17 MR. WOLFF: Public comment.

18 MR. AMICO: Would anyone from the
19 public like to comment this evening? Ma'am?

20 MS. MANCUSO: Good evening, Helene
21 Mancuso of Bednar Street on behalf of the
22 residents on Bednar Street. There's a renter
23 that rented a property at 634 Bednar Street who
24 opened a business without I believe borough
25 consent.

1 I don't believe she had a permit. I
2 talked to Greg and she did not apply for a
3 permit. We are very upset that she had a neon
4 sign in the window. And if you know Bednar
5 Street, we're like this big (indicating.)
6 There is nowhere for, you know, any side
7 parking or whatever.

8 We're just very concerned. This is
9 just a renter. I believe she's from New York.
10 And she -- I have it on text and I shared that
11 with the borough. Everyone else was busy
12 tonight. So I just wanted to bring Council
13 aware of it that none of the residents of
14 Bednar Street are happy.

15 In addition, she decided to pepper
16 our cars with fliers and business cards
17 throughout the entire neighborhood, which we
18 view it as littering and we don't take kindly
19 to that in our neighborhood. And I just thank
20 you for allowing me to speak.

21 MR. AMICO: Thank you, ma'am.
22 Anyone else from the public this evening?
23 Seeing none.

24 MR. WOLFF: Public officials.

25 MR. AMICO: You want to start?

1 MR. WOLFF: Just as I briefed you
2 guys and just for the public, we're having that
3 transition with the health licenses. Liquor
4 licenses are tied into their health licenses.
5 They need them. So what we did was, we reached
6 out to LCB.

7 And they worked with us to make
8 arrangements for our Dunmore businesses with
9 liquor licenses. So they will be receiving a
10 temporary authority letter from the borough.
11 So all of our businesses with the liquor
12 licenses will be receiving these along with the
13 cover letter stating they are able to operate
14 until we get caught up with the transition.

15 So I just wanted to make that
16 public. I briefed Council on this. They're
17 aware of it. So these letters should be going
18 out this week. So they'll be good to go.
19 That's all I got.

20 MR. AMICO: Thank you. Mayor
21 Conway.

22 MAYOR CONWAY: I'm good. Thank you.

23 MR. AMICO: Mrs. Zangardi.

24 MS. ZANGARDI: I have a couple
25 things. I wanted to say thank you or good luck

1 to the officers. Welcome aboard. Dunmore is
2 lucky to have you. Thank you.

3 One of them had a little fun time
4 with my husband, pulled him over because he
5 didn't have a license on his -- the bumper?
6 But anyway, it was just fun. So I appreciate
7 you. No favoritism there at all. I wasn't in
8 on it. But anyway, that's -- Miss Mancuso, do
9 you know the neighbor, the 634 -- the owner of
10 the property?

11 MS. MANCUSO: 634 Bednar Street is
12 being rented by a couple, I believe. I believe
13 the owner is Joy -- don't quote me, O'Malley
14 maybe? I don't know. She moved out. And they
15 moved in like two weeks ago maybe and she
16 immediately opened a business.

17 MS. ZANGARDI: Okay. I was just
18 wondering who was the owner. Chief DeNaples,
19 good luck with the code enforcement. I have
20 the utmost faith in you. You are very
21 meticulous in your work and your details.
22 That's why I voted for you.

23 Like I said to you before, if you
24 need anything I will help you in any way I can.
25 I think you're going to be awesome at it. And

1 I want you to know I'm here to help in any way
2 I can. And I voted for you because I thought
3 you would be perfect.

4 I still think you will be great at
5 it because of you're detail oriented. So I
6 thank you for taking this on. Thank you. And
7 the other thing I'd like to just mention is if
8 we can try to stand together as a Council
9 hiring part time high school students, part
10 time college students, part time summer help,
11 part time winter help, part time Christmas
12 help, a plethora of -- if we can all agree to
13 have a conversation before we hire anybody I
14 would appreciate that. And that's all I have.
15 Thank you.

16 MR. AMICO: Thank you. Mr.
17 O'Malley.

18 MR. O'MALLEY: Good evening,
19 everyone. First of all, I would like to thank
20 our department heads for their always detailed
21 reports. Chief DeNaples, I'm not sure if I
22 should say congratulations or not on your added
23 duty.

24 I just want to say that we know that
25 you will do a great job with code enforcement.

1 You have the full faith and confidence of
2 Council. And we truly appreciate how hard you
3 work for our borough.

4 Officer Grunza and Redmond,
5 congratulations on your full-time status. I
6 hope you both experience happy and safe careers
7 with the police department. And, Mrs. Mancuso,
8 hopefully we can get the business situation
9 resolved for you. I know that Mr. Wolff is
10 working on that. And we'll see where it goes.
11 Thank you. That's all I have.

12 MR. AMICO: Mr. Dempsey.

13 MR. DEMPSEY: I'm good.

14 Congratulations, guys. Glad to have you.

15 MR. AMICO: Mr. Hallinan.

16 MR. HALLINAN: I'm sure they'll help
17 you with the ordinances and see what we can do
18 about that property. Last thing we need is an
19 illegal business in a residential zone.

20 Gentlemen, welcome aboard. My
21 wife's had nothing but good words to say about
22 both of you. So I wish you the best. Thank
23 you for coming on board here. Chief, you're
24 right. Butler Street could have been a very
25 dangerous situation.

1 The guys handled it well. The SWAT
2 Team was called in. Nobody got hurt. So
3 congratulations. Kudos on that. That's all I
4 have. Thank you very much.

5 MR. AMICO: Thanks, Mr. Hallinan.
6 Ms. Oven.

7 MS. OVEN: First of all, I would
8 just like to say welcome to Chief DeNaples for
9 helping us out with the code enforcement.
10 Obviously as Beth said, we're all here to help.
11 And I think it's an important position for the
12 borough. And I think you'll be great at the
13 it. So thank you.

14 To the officers who just got hired
15 full time, congratulations. Everyone sings
16 your praises. So I'm excited you're on board
17 and helping us stay safe. Mrs. Mancuso, thank
18 you for coming to the meeting. It's by you
19 coming to the meeting that we realize these
20 things are going on. So we'll certainly be
21 looking into it. And that's all I have.

22 MR. AMICO: Thank you. Mrs. Brier.

23 MS. BRIER: Well, I just want to say
24 how much we appreciate you taking this on,
25 Chief. And again, with your track record all

1 of these years working as the fire chief it
2 really is going to help the borough out. And I
3 think we lost our code enforcement officer.
4 And you're stepping up to take on this extra
5 duty is really commendable. And we truly
6 appreciate it.

7 And we talked about the situation on
8 Bednar Street right before you came in. It's
9 the tiniest, narrowest street in Dunmore. I
10 don't know where people would park up there. I
11 don't know what the situation is. The Borough
12 Manager will take a look into it and see what
13 we can do.

14 And, you know, we've been following
15 Officer Grunza and Redmond for a year now when
16 we get these reports from the Chief. You guys
17 are always out there working really hard. And
18 it's an exemplary work ethic. And we are so
19 grateful that you are willing to take this on.

20 As you know, there's a nationwide
21 police shortage. So, you know, we really need
22 this for our town. So once again, we're super
23 grateful that you're going to step up and do
24 this for us.

25 MR. AMICO: Thank you. I'll just

1 finish up with again, gentlemen, thank you for
2 joining up and looking forward to working with
3 you for the next, you know, career. You guys
4 25 years, me not 25 years.

5 Chief, again, you know my thoughts.
6 I appreciate you stepping up. It means a lot
7 to me personally. And just one additional
8 thing, we have a few openings in planning and
9 zoning commissions. So if anyone is interested
10 or you know anybody that is interested in
11 stepping up and not just, you know, complaining
12 but actually coming and helping out, that's
13 what we need.

14 And planning and zoning are two of
15 the most important roles in borough government.
16 Actually I think sometimes -- and I mean this
17 sincerely, more important than the decisions we
18 make are decisions that are made on the
19 planning and zoning commissions. So if anybody
20 would like to take part we welcome it.

21 We'll make a decision next month and
22 there will be an ad on our Facebook page and
23 then our borough website will get that squared
24 away this week. And that's really all I have
25 tonight. Nobody else has anything? I'll look

1 for a motion to adjourn.

2 MR. DEMPSEY: I'll make it.

3 MR. AMICO: I have a motion. A

4 second?

5 MS. BRIER: I'll second.

6 MR. AMICO: All those in favor.
