14	second. Can we talk about this for a minute	
15	because it's pretty amazing what these two men	
16	did. There was a person in a crisis situation	
17	in his life and he was climbing over the 81	
18	bridge on Reeves Street.	
19	And they were driving in and they	
20	saw him. And the person had a big knife, a	
21	fixed blade knife as well. And this man went	
22	over, you know, he would probably have died;	
23	but who knows what would have happened to the	
24	people that were driving by on 81.	
25	I mean, this was a really, really	

1 serious, serious incident. And they did not hesitate to intervene and talk to the guy and 2 3 got him down -- physically I guess got him 4 down, called the police. Our police department 5 responded. The State Police responded and the man was taken to get some help. 6 7 So, I mean, I just -- I'm just 8 astounded at what they did. Their really quick 9 thinking probably saved more than one life and 10 we're very, very grateful for the guys doing 11 that and just wanted to recognize that. 12 MAYOR CONWAY: Mrs. Brier, I have a 13 letter from the Dunmore Police Department. Can 14 I read that into the record? MS. BRIER: Please. Read it into 15 16 the record. 17 MAYOR CONWAY: It's dated October 18 3rd, 2024. Dear Mayor Conway and Dunmore 19 Borough Council, I'm writing to inform you that on October 2nd, 2024, Dunmore Police Department 20 21 along with the Pennsylvania State Police, 22 Pennsylvania Ambulance responded to the Reeves 23 Street bridge on a call involving a suicidal 24 male. 25 On behalf of the Dunmore Police

Department, I would like to recognize and thank Mr. Christopher Rinaldi and Mr. Patrick Judge for their heroic handling of the incident. While on their way to the DPW garage, Mr. Patrick Judge and Mr. Christopher Rinaldi observed a man holding a knife while climbing to the top of the security fence over Interstate 81.

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The two gentleman recognized that the male was having a mental health crisis and immediately jumped into action. They safely grabbed the man and pulled him down off the fence while disarming him of a large knife. After ensuring that the male was no longer in danger, Mr. Judge notified the department of the ongoing incident.

17 When police arrived on scene, 18 Mr. Judge and Mr. Rinaldi had the male securely 19 sitting on the side of the roadway. Police 20 were able to safely take the male and get him 21 much needed help. If it wasn't for their brave 22 actions of these two men, the outcome would 23 have been much different. 24

Their heroism, fearlessness, and courage saved the life of a person in distress

6	holiday. The office staff is off today. Chris
7	Kearney is present. Thanks, Chris.
8	MR. KEARNEY: Good evening. These
9	past several weeks we've continued to host
10	parties and events and the start of the Biddy
11	Basketball season. Last weekend, the 4th and
12	the 5th, we hosted the Indo-American Community.
13	And they had their annual fall celebration. It
14	was a high traffic event. There's between
15	eight hundred and a thousand people in there.
16	MS. BRIER: Wow, that's great.
17	MR. KEARNEY: And then on Sunday,
18	the day after the second day, the next morning
19	we had the purse bingo, which I think you know
20	how many people were in there.
21	MS. ZANGARDI: Yeah, a lot.
22	MR. KEARNEY: So I just want to
23	thank my staff, the DCC staff because we can't
24	do this, you know, without them. You really
25	need to know the work that they're doing trying

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1	to clean this place out because there's an
2	awful lot of stuff goes on.
3	MS. BRIER: Both events were in this
4	room?
5	MR. KEARNEY: No. The Indian
6	community had the whole building. So they were
7	eating in here, dancing and everything. And
8	then the purse bingo was doing
9	MS. ZANGARDI: Food in here and then
10	both sides.
11	MR. KEARNEY: It was a busy weekend.
12	So I just wanted to let you know that they
13	helped out extremely a lot. And then
14	following that during the week, Biddy had their
15	tryout period for three nights. And they are
16	going to meet here in this room this week for
17	their draft process for two nights. And they
18	will be starting sometime next week with their
19	practices.
20	And you may have noticed, we are in
21	the process of a gym floor refinish which we do
22	every year. Today was the first coat. And
23	tomorrow they are going to put the finishing
24	coat on and seal it. I need 72 hours where
25	nobody touches it.

15 1 And then we're planning to open Friday afternoon. And these people have been 2 3 doing it for eight years. It's -- they do a 4 really nice job. 5 MS. BRIER: Yeah, you do a really nice job too, Chris, you and your staff, honest 6 7 to gosh. It's wonderful. MR. KEARNEY: Thank you. 8 9 MS. BRIER: And it's well used. 10 That's what we want. 11 MR. KEARNEY: That's all. 12 ALL MEMBERS: Thank you. 13 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge. 14 MR. JUDGE: Judge, we started 15 putting the plows and everything together. Ι 16 hate to even say that, but 'tis the season. 17 MR. LOUGHNEY: Go sit down, Didge. 18 MR. JUDGE: And we're still out 19 there patching and whatever, you know? I guess that's about it. 20 21 So all of your MS. BRIER: 22 equipment, I mean, the trucks, are they okay? 23 MR. JUDGE: Well, we got to get them 24 all together now. They get pretty banged up 25 and bent up. Nothing takes a beating like a

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1	plow. You know, we'll get them all on this
2	week. They'll all be on and we'll have five
3	550s and the two big trucks. So that gives us
4	seven trucks to go out.
5	MS. BRIER: Okay. Didge, when do we
6	do the Christmas decorations?
7	MR. JUDGE: I try to get them up for
8	Thanksgiving.
9	MS. BRIER: You do. We have to take
10	a peek at those I think. They are really
11	hurting, aren't they?
12	MR. JUDGE: Some of them are a
13	little rough. We usually clean them up a
14	little bit. We do go through them if you want.
15	I'll get them all down. They are covered and
16	put away. The day that I take them down, if
17	you want, I'll call you and you could look them
18	over and see what you want, you know?
19	MS. BRIER: Yeah, thanks, Didge.
20	MR. JUDGE: But they'll be up by
21	Thanksgiving. We usually light them
22	Thanksgiving night.
23	MR. WOLFF: Chief Marchese.
24	CHIEF MARCHESE: Calls for service
25	for the month of September, we responded to

1	17 877 calls for service down 24 from the previous
1	877 calls for service down 24 from the previous
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2	month. Arrests for the month, 12 criminal
3	arrests, one non-traffic, 86 traffic arrests,
4	38 written traffic warnings, and 71 verbal
5	traffic warnings.
6	We still have two officers out on
7	Heart and Lung long term. We had eight
8	overtime shifts sent out for the month for
9	overtime. Part time officers worked a total of
10	1,107 hours which is 138 shifts for the month.
11	Officer Burgette took part in the monthly SWAT
12	training September 10th.
13	All department supervisors took part
14	in our coding training September 9th, 10th, and
15	11th. This is the new report writing software
16	our department will be switching to in early
17	November. All patrol officers will receive
18	their training next week.
19	From the start of collection to the
20	end of September we collected \$9,683, including
21	coin, credit card and pay by phone
22	transactions. During the month \$245 was
23	collected in parking tickets and three
24	citations have been filled. Due to the ongoing
25	construction project in and around the corners,

1	we are down four meters.
2	Officers have been working the
3	Dunmore and Prep football games on Friday and
4	Saturday nights. Officers assisted with the
5	crowd patrol at Bucktown Music Fest earlier
6	this month. On September 29th, officers
7	assisted with traffic control for the annual
8	cemetery tour.
9	And our body cameras, our training
10	is starting tomorrow. We should have all the
11	officers trained by the week. And we should
12	have them implemented by Monday for the
13	policies and everything.
14	MS. BRIER: That's great. The
15	training on the new reporting system, is that
16	going to make it more efficient? I mean
17	CHIEF MARCHESE: Yes, the
18	everybody is going to a cloud based system now.
19	We're not there yet. But the company that
20	we're going to go the cloud based system, we're
21	moving into their one now. And so, yeah, we're
22	getting there. It's just a little time
23	consuming.
24	MS. BRIER: Okay. Thank you.
25	CHIEF MARCHESE: Thank you.

2	double parked on the street. It was bad.
3	MS. ZANGARDI: Yeah, blocking
4	handicapped parking and ramps.
5	CHIEF MARCHESE: They really have to
6	revisit that next year, the handicap parking.
7	It's a nightmare. There's nowhere to park.
8	MS. ZANGARDI: But anyway, that was
9	from a neighbor. And again, the Mosaic
10	projects, they're gorgeous too. But really the
11	big proud Dunmore is Chris and Patrick. Also,
12	welcome aboard. Thank you.
13	MS. OVEN: I think Chris and Pat are
14	going to get tired of us you saying it, but I
15	do want to say thank you for doing what you
16	did. In a world that lacks empathy, it was
17	nice that you guys stopped and really averted

14	this place is bumping and that's what we want.	
15	We want it to be used, like, 24/7 but it's	
16	hard. It's hard to keep it clean. It's always	
17	clean. Everybody is safe down here. Your	
18	staff is terrific.	
19	And I just I want to thank you	
20	again for everything you do. And I just love	
21	that communities want to use this place for	
22	their cultural events and, you know, of course,	
23	the purse bingo. But, I mean, it's great.	
24	It's great. So thanks again.	
25	MR. WOLFF: Just a motion to
