1 MR. WOLFF: Just real quick, we had to amend the Police Department had a DROP 2 3 Ordinance. We passed it I believe in the 4 summer. With the settlement that we had with 5 the Chief Marchese, we had to make some amendments specifically for the timeframe for 6 7 Mr. Marchese -- Chief Marchese, I should say, and how long he has to sign up. 8 9 So once we approve this ordinance, 10 if this ordinance is approved, he'll have 30 11 days to enroll in the DROP Program for himself. 12 MS. OVEN: Thank you, Greg. All in favor. 13 14 **ALL MEMBERS:** Aye. 15 MR. WOLFF: Number seven, motion to 16 appoint Mike Brazil to full-time status for 17 Code Enforcement Rental Registration. 18 MS. ZANGARDI: I'll make that 19 motion. MS. OVEN: Can I get a motion to 20 21 appoint Mike Brazil to full-time status for 22 Code Enforcement and Rental Registration? 23 MS. ZANGARDI: I'll make that 24 motion. 25 MR. LOUGHNEY: Second.

MS. OVEN: Greg, do you want to just 1 talk? 2 3 MR. WOLFF: Sure. Mike Brazil has 4 been working part time Tuesdays and Thursdays 5 in our office. He's been working Code Enforcement. He's been helping get together --6 7 put together a Rental Registration Ordinance 8 and program. 9 He's been doing inspections kind of 10 Swiss army knife of Code Enforcement issues 11 that we have been having. He's been helping 12 with the Feral Cat Program. So we're looking to move to full-time status of which the rental 13 14 registration when that -- that should be taking 15 effect July 1st will cover the fees of --16 cover his salary -- the fees from the rental 17 registration. 18 MS. OVEN: Thank you. 19 MR. WOLFF: So he's looking for full-time status. 20 21 MS. OVEN: All in favor? 22 ALL MEMBERS: Aye. 23 MR. WOLFF: Treasury Report, Mark? 24 MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council. 25 My brief summary for the month of January,

2025. It was basically a break-even month, a net loss of \$59.78. As far as revenue is concerned, we received 5,000 for the state -- the Music Fest Grant; miscellaneous revenue 20,000 for the Express Scripts, their third quarter rebate of 2024.

Special assessments of 630K from the fourth quarter of 2024 landfill fees. And we had a 200,000 draw on the TAN to cover the first payroll and operating expenses of the year.

As far as expenses are concerned, it was a three pay period month. Police Station expenses, \$50,000 for the coding computer systems and another -- highway maintenance snow and ice, \$38,000 for rock salt. That's about it.

ALL MEMBERS: Thank you, Mark.

MR. WOLFF: Mr. Kearney is absent.

Mr. Judge.

MR. JUDGE: Hello. Well, we're in the middle of winter so we do a lot of salt. We're out just about every morning, you know? And last weekend we worked the whole weekend.

MS. OVEN: Are you cold patching a

17	day or two behind?
18	MR. JUDGE: Right now we're on.
19	Tomorrow we'll be on schedule. We had two
20	trucks down last week.
21	MR. LOUGHNEY: Mine is today but it
22	wasn't
23	MR. JUDGE: Yeah, we got killed last
24	week.
25	MR. LOUGHNEY: And before we get

everybody on the internet or whatever calling, 1 if we have to put something out there that --2 3 MR. JUDGE: Right. I'll get with 4 you in the morning. I'll know more about it in 5 the morning. MR. LOUGHNEY: I'm just saying if 6 7 it's going to be a couple of days, it's better 8 to put it out there. 9 MR. JUDGE: Yeah, let them know. We 10 had trucks go gown last week. That's why we 11 were a little behind last week. But that's all 12 straightened out. 13 MR. LOUGHNEY: Okay. 14 MR. JUDGE: Okay, so if you have 15 anything. 16 MS. OVEN: Okay. Thank you. 17 MR. WOLFF: Chief Marchese is 18 absent. Chief DeNaples. 19 CHIEF DENAPLES: Good evening, 20 Council. As far as for expenditures for 21 February, the only steep expenditure right now 22 is the annual service for the ladder truck. 23 They come in and do the pump, the generator, 24 the chassis. 25 There's a couple gauges that need to

be replaced on that in addition to the service. So for the service itself, we're looking at about \$3,950. That hasn't increased from last year barring that there is no other issues found. The gauges, they're getting me a price on that.

As far as overtime scheduled from when this report was completed January 31st for February, was 96 hours. So that went down a little bit with, you know, vacations now being prevalent now, etc.

Fifty part-time shifts were put out for the month of February again when I formulated this report. We did receive at the end of last month our water company grant from Pennsylvania American Water was \$500.

So we were able to replace some equipment with that that's needed. Lieutenant Shigo did check the online system for the FEMA grant. He said they're moved into the review process for the gear. So probably they won't start awarding them for another couple months.

And they do that in phases, so probably by July, August it will be completed.

So we'll know whether we made any of the rounds

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or not by then. So I'll keep everybody posted as we continue to check that online system.

As far as for call volume from February 1st to February 10th, today at the close of business, we had a total of 16 fire department responses; one fire; one rescue and emergency medical type service calls; six service calls. A lot of them are actually smoke alarm installs. They are put in that category as service calls.

Good intent was one; false alarms was seven. That's where we come up with a total of 16. As far as for Code Enforcement, there was four Code Enforcement inspections There may be some more that come up scheduled. during the course of the month.

There was four as of noon today when I checked with Faith. That's pretty much all I have for the Code Enforcement and Fire if there is no questions.
