WHEREAS, while serving in World War II his unit liberated Flossenborg discovering salt mines loaded with Nazi gold immortalized in the movie "Monuments Men."

WHEREAS, in the Korean War was awarded the Bronze Medal for remaining steadfast in his duties while in constant danger to maintain essential communications, and

WHEREAS, Charles had a long and distinguished military and post military career and

WHEREAS, his greatest accomplishment and legacy is being the greatest "papa" to all his grandchildren and

So even Delaware Street in front of 13 Nardozzi's along that Blakely Street corridor, 14 all of those crosswalks will be repainted. 15 MR. O'MALLEY: Hopefully Green Ridge 16 Street. 17 MR. WOLFF: Yeah, we'll discuss 18 Green Ridge Street with them. 19 All those in favor. MS. BRIER: 20 ALL MEMBERS: Aye. 21 MS. BRIER: Opposed? Number nine, motion to 22 MR. MR. HALLINAN: On the question? I just want to say this road is well overdue. It's worn out. The shoulders are above the roadway. The water is laying right on the road. This road is in dire need of repair and I'm glad we're taking the first step to get this repaired.

MS. BRIER: It's actually shrinking.

MR. HALLINAN: Correct. Yeah, the pavement is wearing away.

MS. BRIER: Yeah, on the edges.

And, you know, there's a lot of folks that walk up there from Maid-Rite who work at Maid-Rite.

There's a lot of folks that get the bus and get dropped off at Price Chopper because that's the bus stop.

So we're going -- another bus stop.

It will be a bike lane, a walking lane and they'll fix the road which is in dire need of fixing. So this project has been going on for years. We got some state money. And we got

1 some federal money. I think we're good to go 2 finally -- hopefully. Anyone else on the 3 question? 4 MR. O'MALLEY: Yeah, it's all due to Janet's hard work, 1.8 million dollars. 5 Ι mean, the other -- Greg put a lot of time into 6 7 that as well. But you got the ball rolling. Ι 8 just want to acknowledge that. 9 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Trip. Thanks. 10 Anyone else on the question? Did you have 11 anything, Greg? 12 MR. WOLFF: No, I was just going to 13 explain this is just part of the process to get 14 this going. They'll constantly be sending me 15 forms to sign. So this will authorize me to do 16 it. MS. BRIER: All those in favor. 17 18 ALL MEMBERS: Aye. 19 MS. BRIER: Opposed? 20 Number 12, motion to MR. WOLFF: 21 approve Dennis Reed as a part-time firefighter. 22 MS. BRIER: May I have a motion to 23 approve Dennis Reed as a part-time firefighter? 24 MR. HALLINAN: I'll make that 25 motion.

MS. OVEN: I'll second.

MS. BRIER: I have a motion and a second. Anyone on the question?

MR. WOLFF: Chief DeNaples, you went through all the process, right?

CHIEF DENAPLES: Yeah, so Dennis went through the physical agility test, the application review, the police department did the background and driver's license. There is one thing that he needs to complete. So he needs to complete pump operations, one which is scheduled for this month.

One date was delayed due to an instructor issue. So as soon as he gets me proof that he completed that, we could start the orientation process. Because if we don't he doesn't have a base with driving the pump.

It's just going to extend that orientation. We're just going to be paying out a lot of money. He needs to go get a base. He was very honest in the interview and gave us his background which we appreciate. A lot of times we bring people in here and they don't have the base and the orientation is just strung out forever and we just keep paying. So

1 this is the best route to go. So it is going to be completed this month tentatively. 2 3 One day he was moved and he's been keeping me updated in real time. And I 4 5 forwarded him the information for, you know, civil service exam. 6 MS. BRIER: Very good. Very good. 7 8 Thank you. Thanks so much. 9 Thanks, Chief. MR. O'MALLEY: 10 MS. BRIER: Anyone else on the 11 question? All those in favor. 12 ALL MEMBERS: Aye. 13 MS. BRIER: Opposed? 14 MR. WOLFF: Number 13, Treasurer 15 Report, Mark. 16 MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council. 17 Our financial summary for the month of April, 18 we had a net income of the month of 1.3 million 19 dollars, which brings our year-to-date net 20 income to 2.7 million dollars. 21 As far as some highlights from the 22 income side, we continue to see a continued 23 uptick in the real estate tax collections, 24 another 1.5 million dollars this month. 25 As far as miscellaneous revenue, we

had \$18,000 Express Script rebate for the fourth quarter of 2024; \$18,000 subsidiary -- for retirees for 2024 was 18,000. Twenty thousand dollars in insurance claims for a totaled police cruiser.

Special assessments, the landfill fees for this quarter \$576,000. On the expense side, debt principal we paid down \$100,000 on the TAN. So there is another hundred that we paid off in May as well, but we'll get to that next month.

Retirement and pension, \$60,000 partial MMO payment. And insurance premiums, \$76,000 for our quarterly auto liability installment for the 2025 premium. That's all I have.

MR. HALLINAN: Thanks, Mark.

MS. BRIER: Anyone have any questions for Mark?

ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Mark.

MR. WOLFF: Mr. Kearney.

MR. KEARNEY: These past several weeks we've had -- continued to host parties in this room. This Thursday we'll have the seniors have their pasta dinner. They do it

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biannually to raise money for their, you know, things going on here. It's from 4:00 to 7:00 on Thursday.

There is also a party scheduled for Sunday in here. As for the gym, we recently wrapped up our rental agreement with Riverfront Sports. They were here for nine weeks. We continue our weekly rental with Electric City Blitz until the beginning of June.

And then they are coming back.

Mr. Dempsey and I set it up today with -- they are starting in July until September. So they are going to be renting it again. Also, there are several Dunmore grade school teams still practicing.

And coach Toomey and the Lady Bucks is also giving private lessons there. Next Tuesday is Election Day. So we'll be closing Monday at six so we could set up the machines and everything.

And I would like to thank Council for approving the refinish of the gym. I scheduled it for midOctober. You have to schedule these guys out, like, way in advance. They are the biggest group on the east coast.

1 They do all the colleges. Like, you name a college, they're doing it for them. You have 2 3 to get them way in advance. And they do a 4 great job. I mean, I think everybody sees the 5 floors. Thank you. MS. BRIER: Chris, I just want to 6 7 thank you for all the work you've done, you and Jordan, the painting. And it's a vast 8 9 improvement. 10 MR. KEARNEY: Okay, thank you. 11 It looks great. MS. OVEN: 12 MS. ZANGARDI: It does look great. 13 Chris, thank you for everything. 14 MR. KEARNEY: You're welcome. 15 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge. 16 MR. JUDGE: How's it going? We had 17 a problem today. I got three garbage trucks He has two of them up here, Bobby 18 down. 19 Morgan. And the other third one he had to send Now, that we'll be covered except the 20 21 recycling and the --22 MS. BRIER: Didge, is that Bucktown 23 Truck Sales and Service, is that Bobby Morgan? 24 MR. JUDGE: Yes. 25 MS. BRIER: We're paying them

1 \$43,000 this month. 2 MR. JUDGE: I know. I was up there 3 every week --4 MS. BRIER: Didn't we get three new trucks? 5 MR. JUDGE: No, we have two new ones 6 7 that we got -- well, actually three. 8 MS. BRIER: That's what I thought, 9 yeah. 10 MR. JUDGE: And they are on the road 11 They're all going to be out tomorrow. too. 12 They are smaller trucks though, Janet. 13 have to dump two, sometimes three times with 14 those trucks. They're a smaller truck. 15 I'm just letting you know I'm going 16 to leave here now. I was up Morgan's after 17 I'm going to go up now and see where he work. 18 got with them because he had -- one up on the 19 Industrial Park, they said that should be done 20 by morning. 21 So if that happens, we'll have all 22 the trucks -- at least three garbage trucks and 23 a recycle truck. 24 MS. ZANGARDI: Do you know what's 25 wrong with them? Did he say or could you tell

every time --

MR. JUDGE: Two of them is the same thing and it's going to take three weeks to get the part. These trucks are ten years old.

Even parts are hard to get for them now. But I'll get back with you tomorrow. I'll let you know if we got them or how long it's going to take.

MS. BRIER: Are we having a lot of absenteeism in the department as well? What's going on?

MR. JUDGE: Yes. Today there was 10 guys off.

MS. OVEN: Was it called off sick or was it scheduled?

MR. JUDGE: No, sick. So I don't know if something is going on. You know, it is --

MS. BRIER: It's a Monday.

MR. JUDGE: And Monday and golf, but it's usually not that bad, Janet. Do you know what I mean? This is rare. But I had 10 guys off today. We got everything up though. I'll get back with you.

MR. HALLINAN: So we'll be on

schedule, right?

MR. JUDGE: Yeah, so far we're on schedule.

MS. BRIER: Didge, there's in the alley behind Ragnacci's they are asking again if you could just patch if you don't mind.

Thank you.

MR. JUDGE: You know what, Janet, we patched that a ton of times. But it needs to be topped basically. Do you know what I mean? But we'll patch it. We'll get it patched. All right? Okay?

MS. BRIER: Thank you.

ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Didge.

MR. WOLFF: Chief Marchese.

CHIEF MARCHESE: Monthly report for April. We responded to 1,065 calls for service. The number is down by 191 calls.

Arrests for the month, we had 12 criminal arrests; 13 nontraffic, 30 traffic arrests, 13 written traffic warnings, and 27 verbal traffic warnings.

Officer Tillia, he resigned from his position as a part-time officer. He was just in the middle of getting trained. He got a

full-time job with Blakely. Officer Buckley was his last day today. He got a full-time job down in Edwardsville.

Scheduling, we had five overtime shifts for the month for overtime. Officer Burgette took part in his monthly SWAT training on April 8th. April 21 to 24 myself, Captain Barth, Sergeant Richardson and Sergeant Burgette and Detective Mentz took part in a four day Coding Path Finder training in Hershey. That's our new reporting software that we're going to cloud based.

Everybody in the county has to be on it. It was actually a good four days. From the start of the year until the end of April, we have collected \$3,196 including coin, credit card and pay by phone transactions.

For the month of April, we collected \$295 in parking tickets, seven citations were sent out for failure to pay. April 26th, officers assisted with traffic control in the Jog for Jude. And everything was good with no issues at all.

We also got some grant money from the state again. And we're going to be doing

pedestrian crosswalk enforcement. So if you see our guys walking through the crosswalks and stopping people that we'll be out there in the next couple weeks. Thank you.

ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Chief.

MR. WOLFF: Chief DeNaples.

CHIEF DENAPLES: Good evening,

Council. For the month of May, the only expenditure we had projected that was somewhat large was our annual pump service testing for the ladder truck. That was approximately \$500. The other two apparatus, they are getting done during refurb. So we're not going to be paying twice for that.

As far as the overtime scheduled was 324 hours. That went up somewhat due to one of our firefighters having a medical emergency at one of the last fires we had. So I'm not sure how long he's going to be out at this point. He was trying to schedule another appointment.

He was originally given a slip to come back Friday. But that was given by the hospital. And that is no way near accurate. So he's waiting to get an appointment. Hopefully he's going to get that scheduled

between today and tomorrow.

MS. BRIER: With a cardiologist?

CHIEF DENAPLES: A cardiologist,

correct, yes. He was actually at the firehouse in the Borough building late morning this morning.

Fifty three part-time shifts were put out again. That's going to go up a little bit presumably with him being out as soon as we find out a definite time frame. Events we participated in this month was the healthy kids day.

Annually we send the ladder truck. I'll set it up at the YMCA, May 3rd. We were up there from 10 to 2. It was a pretty good turnout except for the last couple hours we got heavy rain. So they cut it short early. As far as the truck refurb, we had a little bit of another setback on the rescue.

So I'm hoping by the end of this month it's back and we could switch it out with the engine. We still have Scranton's engine up there as a reserve base. We're using that as needed. It's not something that is used every day, but we're using it when we need to use it.

Chief?

MS. BRIER: Is that the first one,

CHIEF DENAPLES: The first one. So there was several delays in parts. They were having issues getting parts. It seems to be a nationwide thing with everything, parts. The only other thing that I would like to bring up, I know, Janet, you were there the one day when I had a gentleman out there Costanzo looking at the ramp on the Pine Street side.

So DPW tried to patch that a couple times. And that really wasn't able to hold up. So what I'm trying to prevent is getting in the same situation we had out front. We were lucky enough to get that grant. We actually went over that to replace it.

So the quote we got was 5,800 and change to seal that and do it properly. Now would be the time to do it when we can put the trucks outside because in the winter months, they will freeze outside.

So I'd like to, you know, if we could take a look at that. I did call a couple other companies besides for Costanzo. They did the front and they did a perfect job. And it

seems like everybody you call, we'll get back to you and you don't hear back from them.

They're so busy. So I really -- I know it's a heavy fee.

But I'd like to preserve that so we don't get into a \$30,000 bill to replace that whole thing.

MR. HALLINAN: L R Costanzo could do it immediately?

CHIEF DENAPLES: They could. They were actually -- they called me about a week ago. And it was still in approval process.

But they actually wanted to come two days after they sent me the quote and I said we're still going through the approval process.

As far as for call volume for the last month, the month of April, we had 60 total calls, 2 fire type incidents, rescue and emergency medical services was 16, hazardous materials, hazardous condition was 7, service calls were 5, good intent was 7, false alarms and false calls were 21, special type incidents was two. And that's what got us to 60. So that's pretty much my report.

MS. BRIER: Thanks.

ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Chief.

MR. WOLFF: Number 15, public

comment.

MS. BRIER: Would anyone from the public like to come up and have a comment or have a question? Just come up to the podium and give your name and address. Thanks, Deb, just for Maria.

MS. MURPHY: My name is Debra

Murphy. I live at 2011 Delaware Street,

Dunmore. I have a couple complaints and I'm sure everybody has a lot of them. I live on the corner of Delaware and that alley and I have been complaining for years. Forty years ago we wanted to buy it and they told us that we couldn't because it needed to be a fire truck thing.

But the fire trucks do not use it.

So I've been trying to buy it. I have been asking to have it paved. The holes, there's mud all over my house. It's gotten on the windows, the grates in the windows fall out. I have since gotten a different window so they are in between.

And I have a new fence, like,

1	without the chain link. I have the slats put
2	in. And today I noticed the mud is still going
3	through.
4	MS. BRIER: From the holes.
5	MS. MURPHY: From the holes. And it
6	was just patched. And I washed my fence last
7	week. And I can't afford to use my water every
8	week to wash my house. And I was told by
9	somebody that is not here anymore that it
10	needed to be all dug out and redone.
11	And I know nothing has been done
12	definitely over 25 years and definitely longer
13	so
14	MS. BRIER: Does everyone know where
15	she's talking about?
16	MR. WOLFF: I didn't hear what the
17	issue was.
18	MS. BRIER: It's Delaware Street,
19	like, across from Golden
20	MS. ZANGARDI: Golden's Funeral
21	Home, the alley.
22	MR. LOUGHNEY: Barton Street to Trip
23	to Delaware.
24	MS. BRIER: It just flows into
25	Barton

1	MS. ZANGARDI: The alley she's
2	talking about.
3	MS. BRIER: She lives right next to
4	the alley.
5	MS. MURPHY: It's not even 3 feet
6	between the alley and my house.
7	MR. WOLFF: The potholes and stuff
8	is that what we're
9	MS. MURPHY: They go in the holes
10	and they speed. And one time they put speed
11	bumps in and somebody complained about the
12	speed bumps and they came and they took the
13	speed bumps out. I mean, it's just I mean,
14	is it possible to buy it? It's not an alley.
15	It's actually a street on my deed.
16	MS. BRIER: Oh, it is. What's the
17	street name; do you remember?
18	MS. MURPHY: I'm not sure. I didn't
19	look at it today to make sure. The alley
20	behind the bank, I don't know if that's
21	Brook
22	MR. LOUGHNEY: The alley behind the
23	bank is Exchange Court.
24	MS. MURPHY: Okay, so mine might be
25	Brook.

1 MR. HALLINAN: The street, does it run the whole length of your property and the 2 3 Connors' property? 4 MS. MURPHY: Yes. MR. HALLINAN: Would it be feasible 5 then for us to try to deed it over to you? 6 7 MS. MURPHY: Cindy Frick, we -- I 8 asked her last year if she would buy half and 9 then I would buy the other half and put a 10 barrier where it couldn't be a throughway. 11 MR. HALLINAN: It's a busy street. 12 MS. MURPHY: And they fly there. 13 MR. LOUGHNEY: It's a busy alley 14 because once you come down Barton, you're kind 15 of committed to go through that alley. 16 MS. MURPHY: Right. But people are 17 using it to get away from West Drinker. 18 MR. LOUGHNEY: But we couldn't shut 19 it down and give it to you. MS. BRIER: We could look into it. 20 21 MS. ZANGARDI: We have to look into. 22 It might be too busy of a throughway to just 23 sell it to you -- and is the Connors over there 24 or did you say Cindy Frink? 25 MS. MURPHY: Cindy Frick lives

1	behind me.
2	MS. ZANGARDI: It would be three or
3	four property owners, okay.
4	MS. MURPHY: There's an empty lot
5	Cathy Demeris{phonetic} bought. And she yelled
6	at me because she said you've been trying to
7	buy this for 25 years. And she left town. I
8	think there is only two houses on my block to
9	the Blakely that don't have driveways.
10	MS. BRIER: We could look into that,
11	Deb. We have a five minute limit. But thank
12	you.
13	MS. MURPHY: I'm frustrated. It's
14	got on my dinning room windows in the back of
15	my house. And Didge came through once with the
16	street cleaner.
17	MS. ZANGARDI: How did that go for
18	you?
19	MS. MURPHY: I'm a thorn in his
20	side.
21	MS. BRIER: Thanks, Deb. We'll see
22	what we can do.
23	MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you, Debbie.
24	MS. MURPHY: Thanks for listening.
25	MR. LOUGHNEY: That wasn't bad, Deb.

MS. BRIER: Would anyone else like to address Council? Sure.

MR. RUDDY: Hello. How are you, Bob Ruddy, 1305 Madison Avenue, Dunmore. It's been brought to my attention that maybe possibly some community people in the community may be interested in practicing Yoga. I'm a Yoga instructor.

I was looking to see if I could maybe use the DCC or Schautz Stadium possibly Sunday mornings, one hour, 8:30, 9:30 or 10 to 11 depending on what happens, charge a low fee, 10, 15 bucks, split the cost with the community and myself.

It's in my experience that these things start off a little slow and with vacation it's all who knows what will happen. I will advertise on Facebook and put up some fliers around the community. I don't know if this would be something that is accessible. I would label it as beginners Yoga trying to bring the community that's already great a little closer together.

MS. BRIER: Bob, they do do Yoga here twice a week with.

1 MR. RUDDY: Right with Mindy. 2 MS. BRIER: Mindy, Tuesday and 3 Thursday, but it's free. 4 MR. RUDDY: It's free. That's where I was wondering I didn't know if I should offer 5 it free for community members or whatever. 6 7 It's something that I'm just -- I'm really into 8 it. 9 And it was brought to my attention that maybe some people in the community is also 10 11 interested and I figured maybe give it 8 to 12 12 week class see if it catches on. If not, we'll let it go. If it does, we'll see what could 13 14 happen in the future. MS. BRIER: What is our hours here 15 on Sunday? 16 17 MR. KEARNEY: I have two steady 18 rentals on Sunday. 19 MR. DEMPSEY: Bob, you're welcome to 20 come up to Schautz. 21 MS. ZANGARDI: Sunday morning here, Chris? 22 23 MR. KEARNEY: From 9 to 11:30 I have 24 a group of guys that have been playing here 25 since I started. And then there is another

1 group that I just got last year. The guys that have been here the longest are on the full 2 3 court. They pay. The other group is down at 4 the other end on the one court. I just got 5 them. They pay --MR. HALLINAN: This room would be 6 7 open if you need it. 8 MR. KEARNEY: Yeah. I mean, you 9 would probably have to move --10 MR. HALLINAN: Schautz Stadium might 11 be a better place. 12 MR. DEMPSEY: That would be really 13 cool on a Sunday morning, everybody out to see 14 You'll be seen out there too. That could vou. 15 bring more people who want to get involved --16 MR. HALLINAN: -- up there that 17 Mike's trying to hunt down. 18 MR. DEMPSEY: I think it's just a 19 cat now. 20 MR. RUDDY: It's just a thought. And, of course, with vacations in the summer 21 22 and people have things going on, of course, I 23 don't know what to expect. I figured it might 24 be worth giving it a shot. 25 MR. DEMPSEY: Bobby, I could give

1 you my number after that and I could let you know available dates that I have open and we 2 3 can go from there. 4 MR. RUDDY: Beautiful. Thank you, Mike. 5 MR. HALLINAN: Namaste. 6 Namaste. 7 MR. RUDDY: 8 MS. BRIER: Anyone else want to 9 address Council tonight? Seeing none. 10 MR. WOLFF: All right. Public 11 officials. I have nothing. 12 ATTY. PERRY: I have nothing. 13 MAYOR CONWAY: I just want to say 14 one thing. I know Sergeant Burgette's here. 15 The other day I saw a situation that wasn't 16 very good happening. And I called the second 17 shift and Sergeant Burgette was on so I gave 18 him a call. 19 Not even a minute later it was him 20 and the entire shift were already down there. 21 It was a bad situation that I think they 22 handled very well. It just goes to show that 23 these guys are on it. So I just want to give 24 credit to second shift and Sergeant Burgette. 25 And that's all I have.

MR. LOUGHNEY: I'd like to

compliment Sergeant Burgette too. He took care of a situation close to my neighborhood that I didn't even know it was going on. But, Stephon, thank you very much. You know, they're aware and they're alert and they're out there.

Also, Chief DeNaples, good job to the Fire Department for that structure fire. I'm glad nobody got seriously hurt. And I hope Firefighter Waters comes through it. And tell the entire department great job out there. And to all the candidates that are running next week, good luck.

It's not easy putting your name out there for criticism or praise and I give everyone praise for doing that and best of luck.

MR. O'MALLEY: Thank you.

MS. BRIER: Mike?

MR. DEMPSEY: Yeah, two quick things, Chief, great job. I'm glad nobody was seriously injured. I hope Firefighter Waters is on the mend. I did talk to him. He seems to be doing better. So that's good news. Is

Burgette here? He's popular tonight because I was going to bring this up. The Bucks varsity baseball team just won tonight. That clinches home field advantage for the playoffs. I had an issue. It might have been the same day as Max's where I had to call Stephon because the fans were getting pretty unruly up there and a couple got tossed out.

So he came up with the second shift guys, Aronica -- I forgot who else was there but they responded again in minutes. It brings me to my question to Max -- maybe not a question but a comment.

Max and Chief, if our guys, maybe the union we could approach the school district maybe Superintendant Marichak and see if they'll hire two of our guys like they do for football and they do for basketball to stand up there because we're going to have home playoff games.

The fans are right on top of the kids. They're right on top of the umpires.

And it does get a little dicey up there.

CHIEF MARCHESE: If we don't get an answer let me know. I'll make sure we have

enough guys --

That's it.

MR. DEMPSEY: Would you be interested in getting those extra shifts? I could take guys off the road to do and sometimes they can't respond. It might be better to have them schedule and have --

MS. BRIER: Yeah, like they do for the football --

MR. DEMPSEY: Maybe we could get together tomorrow and call Marichak.

MS. BRIER: That's a great idea.

MR. DEMPSEY: Stephon had the idea.

MR. O'MALLEY: I'd also like to thank Chief DeNaples and the Fire Department, job well done. Thankfully no one was seriously injured. Hopefully Firefighter Waters is on the mend.

I would also like to thank art teacher Cristin Hogan and her art students for their incredible work on the mural out here. It only took them like maybe three times coming to work on it. It's done. It's beautiful. It's great. So I want to say thank you to them, acknowledge them and that's all I have.

1 MS. BRIER: Thank you. Tommy. MR. HALLINAN: 2 Didge, I was just 3 wondering I was going to say before for Debbie, 4 can we run the street sweeper through there and 5 help out and then after you sweep it up can we get it patched? 6 MS. MURPHY: It needs a lot more 7 8 than that. 9 MR. HALLINAN: I'm just saying so we 10 could start going and getting something done, 11 you know? 12 MS. MURPHY: Every single time it 13 rains it gets muddy again. 14 MR. JUDGE: That's been patched a 15 hundred times. It has to be dug up and milled 16 up and done right. It probably hasn't been 17 paved in 30 years. 18 MS. MURPHY: I could remember at 19 least 25. MR. JUDGE: I'll look at it 20 21 tomorrow. MS. MURPHY: It's not fixable. 22 Ι 23 was told by somebody that is retired it needs 24 to be milled. 25 MR. HALLINAN: Probably needs to be

1 dug right up. It's a mess. 2 MS. MURPHY: Thank you for 3 listening. 4 MR. HALLINAN: Also, Chief Marchese, 5 I just got complaints of -- could you keep an eye on Barton Street? I'm sure you are doing 6 7 something there. I don't want to get into your 8 business. Somebody is very upset about what's 9 going on down there. 10 CHIEF MARCHESE: Yeah, I'm aware. 11 MR. HALLINAN: Thank you. That's 12 all. 13 CHIEF MARCHESE: We made several 14 arrests there over the last couple months. 15 MR. HALLINAN: There's kids in and 16 They're unruly. They're cursing at out. They don't even know what's going on. 17 people. 18 Do they live there? Do they don't live there? 19 It's bad. And they are very disrespectful to 20 the neighbors in that area. 21 And another thing, Bucktown Music 22 Fest starts before our next meeting. So that 23 will be June 8th. And we had a great turnout 24 of donations this year, whole new venue, a 25 different -- couple different genres of music.

I hope everything works out there. Thank you. That's all I got.

MS. BRIER: Beth.

MS. ZANGARDI: I'm good. Thank you, just a successful Jog for Jude. Thank God.

Thank you to the Fire and Police Department -- actually all the departments for everything you do really. You guys were busy this month. So thank for everything. That's it for me. Thank you.

MS. BRIER: Katherine.

MS. OVEN: I just want to congratulate Chief DeNaples on that fire successfully putting that out with no injuries. And hopefully Firefighter Waters is back soon.

MS. BRIER: Yeah, I just want to talk about everything that has been going on here in this facility. I mean, Chris made sure the whole thing got painted and the mural.

It's a very, very well used facility. And he keeps it moving. You know, they'll have 500 people for Indian festival.

And between Biddy and pickleball and the yoga, I mean, it's astounding the number of people in and out of here. And it's just a great

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community asset.

And Jog for Jude, like, the big ones, the big ones are really difficult to pull off. And, you know, the elections, the Jog for Jude, there is a lot. It's a heavily used facility. I just want to acknowledge Chris's work here and thank both the Fire Department and the Police Department for a successful day for Jog for Jude.

And even your expertise, Chief, you know, regarding, you know, that other issue. So thank you very much. I just wanted to announce too Council is going on their summer schedule starting in June. So we'll only be meeting one day a month June, July, and August. Typically we meet two days. So that will be out on the website.

MR. WOLFF: Yeah, it's on there.

MS. BRIER: It's on there, okay.
