requirement, Act 167 the counties do these studies. This is for a grant to complete the stormwater study. There is federal and state mandates coming down on all municipalities that have stormwater -- separate stormwater which we do have some.

So this a requirement for all the municipalities in Lackawanna County to approve this memorandum of agreement.

MS. BRIER: Yeah, this Act 167 it's pretty much an unfunded mandate for all of our municipalities. So we do need to collaborate with other municipalities.

MR. WOLFF: This is just a grant for an advisory committee. So this isn't locking us into anything. This isn't creating any fees or anything like that. This is an advisory committee.

MS. BRIER: Yeah, I'm glad the county is taking a leadership position on this. So anyone else on the question? All those in favor.

ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

State and capital 21 operating grants, \$15,000 state fire grant, and 22 miscellaneous revenue 125,000. 23 The surplus distribution payment HIC 24 number one of two. Expensewise, personnel --25 employee benefits, we had \$274,000 for our work

1 comp, our self-insured work comp premium. we're still 165 from the previous carrier. 2 3 MS. BRIER: We'll get a refund? MR. BURTON: We'll have a refund 4 5 from the money that we --MS. BRIER: From Swift? 6 7 MR. BURTON: From Swift that we put 8 up in the beginning of the year before we 9 canceled the policy. 10 MS. BRIER: Great. Thanks. 11 MR. BURTON: Solid Waste, we have 12 \$55,000 in repairs. And then the debt 13 principal we repaid another \$100,000 to the TAN 14 that we took out in the beginning of the year 15 which means we have paid that amount of in full. 16 17 MS. BRIER: Anyone have any 18 questions for Mark? Thanks so much, Mark. 19 ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Mark. 20 MR. WOLFF: Chris Kearney. 21 MR. KEARNEY: Good evening, Council, 22 the past several weeks we've continued to host 23 parties in this room and the gym has been busy 24 We had two parties in here this weekend. also. 25 And we have another scheduled for Saturday.

Electric City Blitz, an AAU team has been renting here. They're finishing up their spring practices on Wednesday this week. And then they begin fall practices in the middle of July weekly until the beginning of September. So it never ends.

Coach Carrie Bowen had the Lady
Bucks practicing here last week because they
were doing something with the gym floor over
there and they had -- they do it every summer
at this time. I did all of this for their
graduation.

And she continues with her private lessons as well. We also have several grade school teams practicing here weekly. Also, with school being out we're opening the gym daily at 11:30. That's all.

CHIEF MARCHESE: Monthly report for May, 2025. During the month of May, our department responded to 1,041 calls for service. The number is slightly down from last

month by 24. Arrests for the month, our department had 12 criminal arrests, 18 non-traffic arrests, 71 traffic arrests, 83 written traffic warnings, and 21 verbal traffic warnings.

Officer Buckley resigned his position part-time officer to accept a full-time position in another department.

Officer Dante Edwards also resigned his position as a part-time officer. He took a full-time position at Blakely PD.

We had four overtime shifts out for the month for overtime. The rest were filled by part timers. Training, Officer Burgette took his monthly SWAT training May 13th and 19th. Supervisors have begun the training process for Pathfinder, which is the new web-based version Cody of our writing software.

From the start of the year to the end of May we have collected \$3,387, including coin, credit card, and pay by phone transactions. For the month of May we collect \$105 in parking tickets. And three citations were sent down for failure to pay.

Five new parking meters were

recently installed in and around the Dunmore

Corners. These are new locations that require

new polls to installed. We have begun the

process of shipping our mobile in-car computers

back to Patrol PC for required security update.

During the month of May, Captain

Springer, Captain Barth and Officer Grunza took

part in a PA aggressive driving grant which is

funded by the state. The program allows

officers to combat aggressive drivers. And

it's fully funded through the state.

Our police department entered into a contract with LexisNexis to provide citizens with a way to access crash reports online. The borough will still receive the funds for the distribution of the crash reports, but will cut back on the need to print them and mail them out. That's all I got.

MS. BRIER: Chief, the new software, is that up and running?

CHIEF MARCHESE: It is. We're supposed to go live in July, yeah. It's taking a little while but we're up and running.

MS. BRIER: Sure. Thank you.

MR. HALLINAN: Can I ask you a

question? I think we may be missing something on those reports that you give to Council of arrests. And I think something that's missing is like incidents because there's a lot times these guys go places and there is no arrest, non-arrest or traffic violation.

So I think there's something that should be added because there's a lot of officers that interact every day with, you know, in dangerous situations but there's not an arrest because of maybe the situation they --

CHIEF MARCHESE: No, we could add that when we give you the total for the month.

CHIEF DENAPLES: Good evening,

Council, I'd just like to take a minute to

congratulate the three officers that were

promoted to sergeant and Patrolman Williams'

elevation to full time. Wish you all the best.

So as far as for expenditures for

June, we had two pretty steep expenditures.

Our annual firehose testing which is done every

year is going to be done tentatively on the 26th. That was 4,452.80. That's testing about 12,000 feet of firehose. That needs to be done every year.

The other pretty steep expenditure that's coming out of our rescue billing account to upgrade some of our rope rescue hardware.

That's \$2,220. Again, that is coming out of rescue billing coffers.

As far as for the overtime scheduled for the month of June when this report was written on the third, there was 450 hours of overtime. That is pretty steep this month.

Next month I project to be about the same or even a little more with vacations.

Again, when this report was prepared, there was 52 part-time shifts put out. They were for part time only. As the police department, we lost one full time -- one part-time firefighter to a full-time position in Wilkes-Barre city. Sara Brodowsky, she's getting sworn in on the 16th.

We're going to keep her on our rolls as we did for a couple other people until she makes it through her probation just in case

something went sideways, she could come back to us. So we did extend that offer to her and we have done that in the past.

So that's pretty much the report.

Just one event we participated in down at the Dunmore Elementary Center was the Rain Rally.

That was scheduled to be done on June 2nd.

However, it was going to rain that day so we moved it to the fourth.

The kids really had a good time with that. It's a charitable event. It's the first time we ever did it. Hopefully we could participate in that maybe again next year. It was really a nice event. The kids really enjoyed it.

As far as calls for the month of May, we ran a total of 64 calls, five fire type incidents, emergency medical service and rescue was 15. Hazardous materials was nine. Service calls were 11. Good intent type calls were two. False alarm and false type calls were 21 and special type incidents was one. That is where the number 64 comes from.

Our truck, I had a little bit of delay in the rescue truck. It's in Alabama

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getting refurbed. They found some issues with the air conditioning unit as they were wrapping things up. So that was delayed a little bit in getting sent back. I'm hoping by the end of the month that truck starts making its way back from Alabama. That is the extent of my report if there's no questions.

MS. BRIER: How is that coming back up here? Will they take that?

CHIEF DENAPLES: They do. That's part of that. It goes through a broker and then, you know, a pool of trucks. They'll bring it back.

home. And the first people to respond were the Dunmore Police.

As you've heard tonight, the first ones we always see on the bunny hunts and all the fun things. People don't think about the background and things they have to see. Due to their quick thinking we got 48 hours extra with our daughter.

In a time of tragedy, especially Officer Igoe, he stayed with our children, comforted them and did things. Statistically children that face tragedy such as ours, they become afraid of emergency responders and the police and different things where all children navigate.

They see the uniform. They see comfort and they see safety. So we want to thank them all, especially Officer Mike as our children call him. And I just want to say our children were all given a small angel to give to those who wanted to offer love and protection.

They held onto them for months. And when we were at the Dunmore Corners working the donuts where, of course, our children

gravitate, our six year old came over and asked for hers that she's been holding onto for months. And when you say to humanize, the person she chose was Officer Igoe out of all the people she had, it was Officer Igoe.

They don't just stop when tragedies happen or event happens. We woke up Christmas morning to text messages from our cops and phone calls. And it's all of them. And we see them at school events. And we see them at dances. And our children know who to go to as well as us.

So we just wanted to thank them.

Sorry, I wasn't here earlier, I wanted to thank all the Council has done for us and sent things and did things as well as the community. You don't find a community like Dunmore. So thank you to everybody.

MS. BRIER: Thank you. Public officials.

MR. WOLFF: I'd just like to again congratulate the sergeants, all you guys. I know you guys. Congratulations to Officer Williams. Navy veteran? We're better people, just ask us. Congratulations to everybody.

And one thing to keep an eye out for since we do have good crowd here, Council approved last month a community alerting service program. So look and we'll be getting word out on how you could sign up for that.

So if there's a police activity, fire activity, your garbage pickup is late, that alert system will get out there. You sign up for it. You'll get the serious alerts, any kind of emergencies, things like that. Look for that. That will be coming out in the next week or so.

MS. BRIER: On our website.

MR. WOLFF: Yeah, well, I'll put it out on Facebook. It will be on our website. Yeah, so they'll be out there. We'll put stuff in the buildings here where you could do a QR code. So we'll be getting an eye out and please pass that onto anyone that you know to get signed up for it.

ATTY. PERRY: I would also like to congratulate the sergeants and Officer Williams. I always want to stay on the good side of the police department.

congratulations again, guys.

Welcome to the team.

I would like to acknowledge the recent passing of a long time school director Michael Butler, good friend to all of us.

Thirty-seven years he spent on Dunmore School Board working tirelessly for the betterment of our school district.

So I want to offer my deepest condolences to the Butler family. I want to thank Councilman Tom Hallinan on his Bucktown Music Fest or Halapalozza as it's called and Brian McGurl.

I know it rained a little bit
yesterday, but the show was great. I look
forward to seeing the rest of the performances
throughout this summer. And as Mr. Wolff

mentioned, the calling system.

I know Tom and I have talked about this for probably a year. But it's going to be great. You're going to get an alert, road closures, recycling and garbage delays. So I'm really looking forward to that and we'll spread the word. But again, thanks everyone for coming and that's all I have.

MS. BRIER: Thanks. Tom.

MR. HALLINAN: Congratulations gentlemen and welcome aboard, Mr. Williams. I can't say any more than -- I'm still trying to hold back the tears from Kate. But, yeah, it's a wonderful community we live in. And these guys make it, you know, so much better and they protect us every day. And no one should go through those tragedies. Thank you. That's all I have.

This is just an unbelievable example, Katie, and I really, really appreciate you coming in and making that public statement. It couldn't have been easy. So thanks everyone for coming and I think we can --
