MS. ZANGARDI: It has been 1 excellent. 2 3 MS. BRIER: All those in favor? 4 ALL MEMBERS: Aye. 5 MS. BRIER: Opposed? (No response.) 6 MR. WOLFF: Number 10, Treasurer 7 8 financial Report, Mr. Mark. 9 MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council. 10 I'll be very brief. There's not much to report 11 to be quite honest with you. For the month of 12 June we have a net loss of \$467,000 which 13 brings our year-to-date net income to 2.1 14 million dollars. 15 As far as revenues and expenses, 16 they are standard for the month, typically 17 summer decrease in revenues and standard 18 monthly expenses, nothing in particular out of 19 the ordinary to report. That's it. 20 ALL MEMBERS: Thank you. 21 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Mark. 22 MR. WOLFF: Thanks, Mark. Mr. Judge 23 is -- I'm sorry, Chris Kearney. 24 MR. KEARNEY: Good evening. These 25 past several weeks have seen us continue

hosting parties in this room on the weekends and a ramping up our Dunmore School basketball team started preseason practices. There's a bunch 2nd, 4th and 5th grade teams that are coming to practice in the evenings.

Coach Bowen from the Lady Bucks, she's doing some trainings with young players. That's all for the gym besides the program. The Summer Recreation Program started Monday, July 7th. As of Friday, we had 170 kids registered at the camps.

Our thanks to Mr. Hallinan for arranging for the pizza and the treats for the camps on Friday. He's also arranged for an ice cream truck to visit on our last day for our annual Parks Day, so thank you, Mr. Hallinan. That's all that I have.

MS. BRIER: The floor.

MR. KEARNEY: Pardon me?

MS. BRIER: The floor.

MR. KEARNEY: The hallway, yes,

Paramount did it about a week ago, week or so
ago.

MS. BRIER: And so we have discovered that we do have equipment to do

1 that? 2 MR. KEARNEY: Instead of buying a 3 new buffer, I talked to the people. We have a 4 buffer for that gym floor. And I talked to 5 them and all we have to do is change the pads. It's a lot cheaper and we could use that buffer 6 7 out here. 8 MS. BRIER: Do we have the pads, 9 Chris? 10 MR. KEARNEY: Yeah, I ordered them 11 already. We're going to do it -- right now it's kind of hard --12 MS. BRIER: Well, not now, yeah. 13 14 MR. KEARNEY: So once the summer 15 camp is over we're going to try to do a weekly 16 buffering schedule. It's just difficult to do 17 it right now. 18 MR. O'MALLEY: So it will wax the 19 floor too? 20 MR. KEARNEY: Yeah, polish and 21 everything. The floor looks nice and 22 MS. BRIER: 23 Paramount did a good job. It's a heavy 24 travelled area. 25 MR. KEARNEY: Yeah, that has really

not been done since 2006. So they did a really good job I thought. We had to keep the mats up for a day or two. Everything is good.

ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Chris.

MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge is not here tonight. Chief Marchese.

CHIEF MARCHESE: Monthly reports for June of 2025. During the month of June our department responded to 1,046 calls for service. This number is up by five calls from the previous month.

Arrest for the month, we had 11 criminal arrests, five nontraffic, 30 traffic arrest, 10 written traffic warnings and 56 verbal warnings.

We have four overtime shifts sent out for the month for overtime. Part time officers worked a total of 656 hours.

Training, Officer Burgette took part in his monthly SWAT training on June 30th. All officers took part in the four hour mandatory Pathfinder report writing software training.

All officers took part in our yearly firearm qualification. This was held over four days at Canaan Federal Prison Range.

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From the start of the year to the end of June, we have collected \$5,196 including coin, credit card and pay by phone transactions. For the month of June, we collected \$105 in parking tickets. Three citations were sent down for failure to pay.

The first round of mobile computers has been upgraded from Patrol PC will be back in service in the next week or so. The second batch is to be sent out later this week. There was a security update that was required by the FBI in order for us to continue to use the mobile computers.

Officers assisted with the traffic and crowd patrol at the Bucktown Music Fest on Sunday. And that's all I got.

MS. BRIER: Chief, the 30 tickets, is that a lot for one month?

CHIEF MARCHESE: Citations, yeah, it depends. Sometimes we'll have money come in from the State where we'll do click or ticket or aggressive driving. You'll see numbers go up and down. That is why they usually vary. And our National Night Out parade is scheduled for August 12th.

MR. WOLFF: Chief DeNaples is not present. Number 12, public comment.

MS. BRIER: Anyone from the public, come up.

MS. MCLANE: Good evening. My name is Elizabeth McLane. I'm a Dunmore resident and the current President-elect of the Junior League of Scranton. For those of you who don't know, the Junior League of Scranton is an organization of women committed to advancing women's leadership for a meaningful community impact through volunteer action, collaboration and training.

Currently the Junior League of
Scranton has over 30 active members. This year
we logged close to 400 community service hours.
However, I did not come here tonight to tell
you about the amazing things we have
accomplished.

I come to ask for your help. As you know, the Feeney family of Dunmore experienced an unthinkable tragedy in July of 2024. I come

to know the Feeneys as a wonderful family in our neighborhood who always have an open door leading to open arms.

Katie Feeney also happens to be one of our active Junior League of Scranton members. As a league, we try to strive to make our community the goal, but our members are always the mission.

On behalf of the Junior League of Scranton, I'm here to ask the Dunmore Borough Council for input and ultimately approval to plant a tree with a plaque to honor Erin's memory within our Dunmore community.

The project is to be funded through the funds of the Junior League of Scranton.

With your approval, we would also like input on location and any and all aspects of this project that may be of concern to the Borough.

The 29th, they'll be at Alesworth. It's from 10 a.m. to noon. It's a free event. There's food, fun, activities, face painting and painting of the bird houses, character drawings. And again, lots of fun activities.

MR. CORDELLI: It's not part of our county system.

MS. BRIER: The system, okay.

MR. CORDELLI: Sorry.

MS. BRIER: That's okay.

MR. CORDELLI: That's a good question. Next we have a bake sale fundraiser for the independent living youth. It's going to be this Friday at our Government Center in the main lobby from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. or --

MS. BRIER: That's the county.

MR. CORDELLI: They're going to have cookies, cakes, cupcakes, brownies, Crumbles.

What's a Crumble? I don't know. If it's sugar I'm in -- fudge and more, so another wonderful event there.

All right, the Trolley Museum is continuing their special events with characters. The one most recently had the two witches from Wicked. But next month it's going to be Batman on August 16th. I'm Batman. And September, it's going to be the beautiful stars from Frozen. And the times the trolley launches is on here if you're interested in taking part.

MR. O'MALLEY: We did the Star Wars one a couple years ago and it was awesome. The kids loved it. It was really cool.

MS. BRIER: Can we get these on our website?

MR. WOLFF: Yeah, just send them to me PDF like you normally do.

MR. CORDELLI: Absolutely. Thank you. Okay, next, our Area Agency on Aging has already launched the free event for residents 60 and older, Fridays in the Park. It is the older version of arts in the park where there is crafts, entertainment, food, bingo, nutritional education and much, much more.

They are going to be at Covington

Park this Friday, Merli Sarnowski Park on the

25th of July and McDade Park on August 1st. So again, its for resident here in Lackawanna County that are 60 plus. It's free event.

If anybody needs a ride, there's a phone number they just ask to call and they'll set up arrangements for transportation to take someone up there. Also, our Area Agency on Aging is winding down their Lackawanna County Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program, the coupon opportunity for those with household income eligibility.

It's all listed on here. The last two dates -- the next one is going to be July 19th at South Scranton Farmers Market and then on July 23rd next week at the Scranton Co-op Farmer's Market, so wonderful event if anybody does meet the criteria.

RailRiders as we know are winding down their season. But their camps are still going on. They have two more, one next week for those boys and girls that are 6 to 14 years old, take advantage of some great baseball instructors and also get to play in a major league AAA stadium, the Yankees. So great opportunity there.

The tradition continues. I heard Chris. Chris is going to talk about it. He's going to sign up for this is the Lackawanna County's 3 on 3 basketball tournament. Street basketball, come on, right? Hoop it up. You guys would win your division real easy.

MS. BRIER: As long as it's not on the pavement.

MR. CORDELLI: Unfortunately it is.

All right. It will be Friday, 25th of July,
the 26th with a rain date of Sunday the 27th.

It ranges from boys and girls from 4th grade
all the way up to open division. The cost is
\$25 per person, maximum of five players per
team.

That's a total of \$125. So \$25, you get to play in at least three games throughout the weekend. And if you are interested,
Riverfront is hosting and sponsoring the event as well as taking registration. You can scan the QR code here and get your teams registered.

This program has been going on for a year and a half. It is the Pennsylvania

Department of Health free blood lead screening opportunity for those one year olds to six year

olds, with all the chemicals that are going on in the world with food and everything else.

It will give people peace of mind, your child, a grandchild. All you have to do is call the number on the list here on the form to set up an appointment and they are located at 100 Lackawanna Avenue, Downtown Scranton. After this month they are stopping that program.

And lastly, our Register of Wills and Marriage License Bureau is extending their hours on the last Thursday of each month up to and through October of this year to go from 4 to 7 to accommodate those who might be working and not able to get down there for new marriage licenses or for Real ID.

Ladies as we know Real ID is -everybody, Real ID is a factor. It's a real
deal. And if I may share with everybody a
personal story. My wife had not applied for
her Real ID so we went to get one. So I was
helping her out.

Well, when the Department of
Transportation put out the criteria that the
information that we need to get a Real ID, your

Social Security number, driver licenses -- I'm sorry, Social Security, birth certificate, marriage license if you are married.

So my wife and I -- not to brag, but we got married last century. Back in the day marriage licenses weren't this large back then. They were like this and cut in half and were kind of lime green.

And we got married Peckville at the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Father Purcell, the signature on it was blue and you could feel the raised imprint, embossed. So we brought that.

We thought got everything we need to go and get her new Real ID. Well, she pulls it out. And the lady said, that's not good. We said you didn't even feel it. It's a real one, no, no, no. What do we need? She said you need to go down to Lackawanna County and get a county marriage license.

MS. BRIER: Oh, not from the church.

MR. LOUGHNEY: You can't have a raised seal. You should have known that, Mark.

MR. CORDELLI: They didn't specify that. You're right, Nibs. Silly me, brain fog. I'm just trying to help to make it easier

1 for everybody else. MS. BRIER: Mark, I just got mine. 2 3 I didn't need my marriage license. I had 4 Social Security. I had a passport. Maybe the 5 passport and a bill from my house. MR. LOUGHNEY: Right, you need a 6 7 bill. 8 MS. BRIER: And my old license. Ι 9 thought -- again, I got married in the last 10 century -- over -- half a century ago. 11 were eloping to DC. And I tried five times to 12 get it from DC and they wouldn't. They just 13 ignored me. So I don't have a marriage 14 Maybe I'm not married. license. 15 MR. CORDELLI: I didn't hear a word. 16 Thank you. 17 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Mark. Thanks so 18 much for coming and doing this for us. We 19 really appreciate it. 20 MS. OVEN: Thank you. 21 MS. BRIER: Thank you. 22 MR. LOUGHNEY: Thank you. 23 MS. BRIER: Anyone else want to address Council tonight? 24 25 MR. WOLFF: Number 13, public

officials. I have nothing.

ATTY. PERRY: I don't have anything.

MAYOR CONWAY: I have nothing.

MR. LOUGHNEY: I just mentioned to Greg before but I will mention it again. O'Neill Highway in front of the new Big Lots and stuff, that thing is so overgrown. terrible. And if you could send PennDOT something coming off 81 right by the cemetery, you can't even see the Dunmore sign.

It's all overgrown, just when you are coming into town if that could just be -and other than, Greg, good job with the alert system on the 911 situation. It went very well I guess, right?

MR. WOLFF: Yeah, yeah. If you saw in central Texas, they mentioned the code red. That is the program we just -- the officer on scene said can you send a code red alert out. That's the program that we have.

MR. LOUGHNEY: Good job. You got it That's it. going. Thank you.

MR. O'MALLEY: I also wanted to mention the call system. I have been getting the alerts, so that's good. It's a positive

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thing. Do you know how many people are signed up for it?

MR. WOLFF: Last time I checked, it was over 300.

MR. O'MALLEY: I think we should try to do another push to try to get more people because we got the alert when the garbage was delayed and that was great.

Also again, I want to thank Miss McLane and the Junior League of Scranton for coming. I'll give you my contact information so we'll be in touch as to what we're going to do. And really from the bottom of our hearts, thank you very much. And that's all I have.

MS. BRIER: That's a really lovely gesture. I have been getting alerts too. So we know it works and the daily thunderstorms, you know, you get an alert every day. It's an unbelievable amount of rain coming. And, you know, I'm sure those people in Texas didn't expect that horrible, horrible situation, 26 foot high surge.

And you don't even think that's possible. And so I think it's a great idea for us to have that here. And I do also want to

thank -- I know we do it a lot but, Tommy, the Music Fest has been wonderful. So thanks again.

MS. ZANGARDI: I'm good. Everything they said, they took it all off of me. Thank you for coming. That's awesome.
