3 MR. WOLFF: Roll call, Mayor Conway.

4 MAYOR CONWAY: Here.

5 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Loughney.

6 MR. LOUGHNEY: Here.

7 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Dempsey is absent.

9 MR. O'MALLEY: Here.

10 MR. WOLFF: Mrs. Brier.

20 MS. BRIER: All right. Does anyone  
21 from the public would like to comment on agenda  
22 items only? Seeing none, we could go to four.

23 MR. WOLFF: Number four, motion to  
24 approve the minutes of the meeting from the  
25 June 9th, 2025 meeting.

1 MS. BRIER: Okay. May I have a  
2 motion to approve the minutes from the June  
3 9th, 2025 meeting?

4 MR. O'MALLEY: Motion.

5 MS. OVEN: Second.

6 MS. BRIER: I have a motion and a  
7 second. Anyone on the question? All those in  
8 favor.

9 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

10 MS. BRIER: Opposed?

11 (No response.)

12 MR. WOLFF: Number five, motion to  
13 approve and pay the open bills.

14 MS. BRIER: May I please have a  
15 motion to approve and pay the open bills?

16 MR. LOUGHNEY: So moved.

17 MS. BRIER: All right. I have a  
18 motion. Can I have a second?

19 MS. OVEN: Second.

20 MS. BRIER: All right. Anyone on  
21 the question? We talked about this a little  
22 bit prior to this meeting. There's a  
23 passthrough for the house that burnt down up on  
24 Meade Street. It's just an insurance  
25 passthrough that we're paying \$24,000. All

1           those in favor.

2                   ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

3                   MS. BRIER: Opposed?

4                   (No response.)

5                   MR. WOLFF: Number six, motion to  
6 approve camp staff for Summer Parks Program.

7                   MS. BRIER: May I have a motion to  
8 approve camp staff for Summer Parks Program?

9                   MR. HALLINAN: I'll make that  
10 motion.

11                   MS. ZANGARDI: I'll second.

12                   MS. BRIER: Okay. We have a motion  
13 and a second. Anyone on the question? All  
14 those in favor?

15                   ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

16                   MS. BRIER: Opposed?

17                   (No response.)

18                   MR. WOLFF: Number seven, motion to  
19 authorize Solicitor to execute a 99-year lease  
20 agreement with the American Legion, Dunmore  
21 Post 13 for Borough owned 618 South Blakely  
22 Street Parcel 14615010004.

23                   MS. BRIER: Okay. May I have a  
24 motion to authorize our Solicitor to execute a  
25 99-year lease agreement with the American

1 Legion, Dunmore Post 13 for Borough owned 618  
2 South Blakely Street Parcel 14615010004.

3 MR. HALLINAN: I'll make that  
4 motion.

5 MS. ZANGARDI: I'll second.

6 MS. BRIER: Okay. I have a motion  
7 and a second. Anyone on the question?  
8 Greg, can you explain that a little bit?

9 MR. WOLFF: Sure. The American  
10 Legion, the Dunmore Post reached out to -- I'm  
11 actually a member and Council member Hallinan  
12 seeking the use of the property that we own  
13 right next to La Cuccina Restaurant. It's a  
14 vacant property that the Borough has not used  
15 that the Borough has owned for quite a few  
16 years, has no use for it, has not used the  
17 property.

18 So again, the American Legion is  
19 looking to build just a small little building  
20 to call their own to meet. And they'll have to  
21 obviously follow any zoning, any laws, any  
22 permits. They'll have to go through that whole  
23 process for whatever they do.

24 Solicitor will put together the  
25 lease. If they dissolve, something happens, it

1 will revert back to the Borough.

2 MS. BRIER: Yeah, Greg was saying  
3 that they meet now and in the winter at the  
4 Holiday Inn and in the summer at Sherwood. So  
5 it would be nice if they have a home. They  
6 always did have one on Clay Avenue years ago  
7 that had a bowling alley and a bar and  
8 everything, but that would be nice. All right.  
9 All those in favor?

10 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

11 MS. BRIER: Opposed?

12 (No response.)

13 MR. WOLFF: Number eight, motion to  
14 approve CDBG Modification of Certification,  
15 \$1,000 for Chestnut Street Phase 2-2.

16 MS. BRIER: Okay. May I have a  
17 motion to approve CDBG Modification of  
18 Certification, \$1,000 for Chestnut Street Phase  
19 2-2.

20 MR. O'MALLEY: Motion.

21 MS. OVEN: Second.

22 MS. BRIER: I have a motion and  
23 second. Anyone on the question?

24 MR. WOLFF: This was just needed  
25 because the project that has already been bid

1 out, the gas company found some issues that  
2 they are going to have to take care of. So the  
3 project will be delayed past the September 25th  
4 deadline. So that's why we need this  
5 modification.

6 MS. BRIER: Okay. All those in  
7 favor?

8 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

9 MS. BRIER: Opposed?

10 (No response.)

11 MR. WOLFF: Number nine, motion to  
12 approve Resolution No. 9 of 2025, reinvest  
13 grant application with Lackawanna County for  
14 Music Fest.

15 MS. BRIER: Okay. May I have a  
16 motion to approve Resolution No. 9 of 2025 to  
17 reinvest grant application with Lackawanna  
18 County for the Music Fest?

19 MR. HALLINAN: I'll make that  
20 motion.

21 MS. BRIER: I have a motion. A  
22 second?

23 MR. O'MALLEY: Second.

24 MS. BRIER: Anyone on the question?

25 MR. O'MALLEY: It's been great.

1 MS. ZANGARDI: It has been  
2 excellent.

3 MS. BRIER: All those in favor?

4 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

5 MS. BRIER: Opposed?

6 (No response.)

7 MR. WOLFF: Number 10, Treasurer  
8 financial Report, Mr. Mark.

9 MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council.  
10 I'll be very brief. There's not much to report  
11 to be quite honest with you. For the month of  
12 June we have a net loss of \$467,000 which  
13 brings our year-to-date net income to 2.1  
14 million dollars.

15 As far as revenues and expenses,  
16 they are standard for the month, typically  
17 summer decrease in revenues and standard  
18 monthly expenses, nothing in particular out of  
19 the ordinary to report. That's it.

20 ALL MEMBERS: Thank you.

21 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Mark.

22 MR. WOLFF: Thanks, Mark. Mr. Judge  
23 is -- I'm sorry, Chris Kearney.

24 MR. KEARNEY: Good evening. These  
25 past several weeks have seen us continue



1           hosting parties in this room on the weekends  
2           and a ramping up our Dunmore School basketball  
3           team started preseason practices. There's a  
4           bunch 2nd, 4th and 5th grade teams that are  
5           coming to practice in the evenings.

6                     Coach Bowen from the Lady Bucks,  
7           she's doing some trainings with young players.  
8           That's all for the gym besides the program.  
9           The Summer Recreation Program started Monday,  
10          July 7th. As of Friday, we had 170 kids  
11          registered at the camps.

12                    Our thanks to Mr. Hallinan for  
13          arranging for the pizza and the treats for the  
14          camps on Friday. He's also arranged for an ice  
15          cream truck to visit on our last day for our  
16          annual Parks Day, so thank you, Mr. Hallinan.  
17          That's all that I have.

18                   MS. BRIER: The floor.

19                   MR. KEARNEY: Pardon me?

20                   MS. BRIER: The floor.

21                   MR. KEARNEY: The hallway, yes,  
22          Paramount did it about a week ago, week or so  
23          ago.

24                   MS. BRIER: And so we have  
25          discovered that we do have equipment to do

1           that?

2                   MR. KEARNEY:  Instead of buying a  
3           new buffer, I talked to the people.  We have a  
4           buffer for that gym floor.  And I talked to  
5           them and all we have to do is change the pads.  
6           It's a lot cheaper and we could use that buffer  
7           out here.

8                   MS. BRIER:  Do we have the pads,  
9           Chris?

10                  MR. KEARNEY:  Yeah, I ordered them  
11           already.  We're going to do it -- right now  
12           it's kind of hard --

13                  MS. BRIER:  Well, not now, yeah.

14                  MR. KEARNEY:  So once the summer  
15           camp is over we're going to try to do a weekly  
16           buffering schedule.  It's just difficult to do  
17           it right now.

18                  MR. O'MALLEY:  So it will wax the  
19           floor too?

20                  MR. KEARNEY:  Yeah, polish and  
21           everything.

22                  MS. BRIER:  The floor looks nice and  
23           Paramount did a good job.  It's a heavy  
24           travelled area.

25                  MR. KEARNEY:  Yeah, that has really

1 not been done since 2006. So they did a really  
2 good job I thought. We had to keep the mats up  
3 for a day or two. Everything is good.

4 ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Chris.

5 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge is not here  
6 tonight. Chief Marchese.

7 CHIEF MARCHESE: Monthly reports for  
8 June of 2025. During the month of June our  
9 department responded to 1,046 calls for  
10 service. This number is up by five calls from  
11 the previous month.

12 Arrest for the month, we had 11  
13 criminal arrests, five nontraffic, 30 traffic  
14 arrest, 10 written traffic warnings and 56  
15 verbal warnings.

16 We have four overtime shifts sent  
17 out for the month for overtime. Part time  
18 officers worked a total of 656 hours.  
19 Training, Officer Burgette took part in his  
20 monthly SWAT training on June 30th. All  
21 officers took part in the four hour mandatory  
22 Pathfinder report writing software training.

23 All officers took part in our yearly  
24 firearm qualification. This was held over four  
25 days at Canaan Federal Prison Range.

1                   From the start of the year to the  
2                   end of June, we have collected \$5,196 including  
3                   coin, credit card and pay by phone  
4                   transactions. For the month of June, we  
5                   collected \$105 in parking tickets. Three  
6                   citations were sent down for failure to pay.

7                   The first round of mobile computers  
8                   has been upgraded from Patrol PC will be back  
9                   in service in the next week or so. The second  
10                  batch is to be sent out later this week. There  
11                  was a security update that was required by the  
12                  FBI in order for us to continue to use the  
13                  mobile computers.

14                  Officers assisted with the traffic  
15                  and crowd patrol at the Bucktown Music Fest on  
16                  Sunday. And that's all I got.

17                  MS. BRIER: Chief, the 30 tickets,  
18                  is that a lot for one month?

19                  CHIEF MARCHESE: Citations, yeah, it  
20                  depends. Sometimes we'll have money come in  
21                  from the State where we'll do click or ticket  
22                  or aggressive driving. You'll see numbers go  
23                  up and down. That is why they usually vary.  
24                  And our National Night Out parade is scheduled  
25                  for August 12th.

1 MS. BRIER: Yeah, that will be nice.  
2 Thank you.

3 ALL MEMBERS: Thank you.

4 MR. WOLFF: Chief DeNaples is not  
5 present. Number 12, public comment.

6 MS. BRIER: Anyone from the public,  
7 come up.

8 MS. MCLANE: Good evening. My name  
9 is Elizabeth McLane. I'm a Dunmore resident  
10 and the current President-elect of the Junior  
11 League of Scranton. For those of you who don't  
12 know, the Junior League of Scranton is an  
13 organization of women committed to advancing  
14 women's leadership for a meaningful community  
15 impact through volunteer action, collaboration  
16 and training.

17 Currently the Junior League of  
18 Scranton has over 30 active members. This year  
19 we logged close to 400 community service hours.  
20 However, I did not come here tonight to tell  
21 you about the amazing things we have  
22 accomplished.

23 I come to ask for your help. As you  
24 know, the Feeney family of Dunmore experienced  
25 an unthinkable tragedy in July of 2024. I come

1 to know the Feeneys as a wonderful family in  
2 our neighborhood who always have an open door  
3 leading to open arms.

4 Katie Feeney also happens to be one  
5 of our active Junior League of Scranton  
6 members. As a league, we try to strive to make  
7 our community the goal, but our members are  
8 always the mission.

9 On behalf of the Junior League of  
10 Scranton, I'm here to ask the Dunmore Borough  
11 Council for input and ultimately approval to  
12 plant a tree with a plaque to honor Erin's  
13 memory within our Dunmore community.

14 The project is to be funded through  
15 the funds of the Junior League of Scranton.  
16 With your approval, we would also like input on  
17 location and any and all aspects of this  
18 project that may be of concern to the Borough.

19 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Elizabeth. Will  
20 you just give Maria your address?

21 MS. MCLANE: Absolutely, 2113  
22 Jefferson Avenue.

23 MS. BRIER: Thank you. Of course,  
24 we're very interested in doing this.

25 MR. O'MALLEY: Katie Feeney is my

1 first cousin. Their daughter Erin passed one  
2 year ago today, a terrible accident. So you  
3 know, I just want to say on behalf of our  
4 family we really appreciate what you're doing.

5 MS. BRIER: Yes, it's really  
6 wonderful. So you just need a location. Do  
7 you guys have anything in mind? Do you want it  
8 up in that neighborhood? Do you want it at  
9 Dunmore Corners, what were you thinking?

10 MS. MCLANE: We're really open to  
11 anything.

12 MR. LOUGHNEY: How about right here  
13 in the park where all the kids are going to be?

14 MS. BRIER: Yeah, where the kids  
15 are. Would this be a good location? There's a  
16 lot of kids here.

17 MS. MCLANE: This would be ideal. I  
18 know they go for walks. They're out in the  
19 community. They are involved in absolutely  
20 everything.

21 MS. BRIER: Yeah, I like this idea  
22 because there's so many kids here.

23 MS. OVEN: Yeah.

24 MS. BRIER: So will you just circle  
25 back and then we'll get a spot?

1 MR. O'MALLEY: Yeah.

2 MS. BRIER: And then we'll have like  
3 a little ceremony.

4 MS. MCLANE: Sounds great. Thank  
5 you.

6 MS. BRIER: Thanks for doing this.  
7 We really appreciate it. Would anyone else  
8 like to address counsel?

9 MR. CORDELLI: Good evening,  
10 Council, everyone, Mark Cordelli, Lackawanna  
11 County. I'll go through these fairly quickly.  
12 Happy summer. I'll make it quick. Several of  
13 these are repeats. But they are going to be  
14 timing out soon.

15 For example, the Trolley Museum  
16 offers the take a trolley down to the  
17 RailRiders baseball game. There are four more  
18 Sundays left. The season is almost done, four  
19 more Sundays left to take advantage of this  
20 wonderful opportunity.

21 Next is our Art and Cultures  
22 Department, Art in the Park, it's a free event.  
23 It's held on every Tuesday in July. For  
24 example, last Tuesday we are at Merli Sarnowski  
25 Park. This you Tuesday, tomorrow, they're



1           going to be at Covington.

2                       On the 22nd they'll be at McDade.  
3           The 29th, they'll be at Alesworth. It's from  
4           10 a.m. to noon. It's a free event. There's  
5           food, fun, activities, face painting and  
6           painting of the bird houses, character  
7           drawings. And again, lots of fun activities.

8                       MS. BRIER: Do they do Nay Aug  
9           Park?

10                      MR. CORDELLI: It's not part of our  
11           county system.

12                      MS. BRIER: The system, okay.

13                      MR. CORDELLI: Sorry.

14                      MS. BRIER: That's okay.

15                      MR. CORDELLI: That's a good  
16           question. Next we have a bake sale fundraiser  
17           for the independent living youth. It's going  
18           to be this Friday at our Government Center in  
19           the main lobby from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. or --

20                      MS. BRIER: That's the county.

21                      MR. CORDELLI: They're going to have  
22           cookies, cakes, cupcakes, brownies, Crumbles.  
23           What's a Crumble? I don't know. If it's sugar  
24           I'm in -- fudge and more, so another wonderful  
25           event there.

1 All right, the Trolley Museum is  
2 continuing their special events with  
3 characters. The one most recently had the two  
4 witches from Wicked. But next month it's going  
5 to be Batman on August 16th. I'm Batman. And  
6 September, it's going to be the beautiful stars  
7 from Frozen. And the times the trolley  
8 launches is on here if you're interested in  
9 taking part.

10 MR. O'MALLEY: We did the Star Wars  
11 one a couple years ago and it was awesome. The  
12 kids loved it. It was really cool.

13 MS. BRIER: Can we get these on our  
14 website?

15 MR. WOLFF: Yeah, just send them to  
16 me PDF like you normally do.

17 MR. CORDELLI: Absolutely. Thank  
18 you. Okay, next, our Area Agency on Aging has  
19 already launched the free event for residents  
20 60 and older, Fridays in the Park. It is the  
21 older version of arts in the park where there  
22 is crafts, entertainment, food, bingo,  
23 nutritional education and much, much more.

24 They are going to be at Covington  
25 Park this Friday, Merli Sarnowski Park on the

1           25th of July and McDade Park on August 1st. So  
2           again, its for resident here in Lackawanna  
3           County that are 60 plus. It's free event.

4                     If anybody needs a ride, there's a  
5           phone number they just ask to call and they'll  
6           set up arrangements for transportation to take  
7           someone up there. Also, our Area Agency on  
8           Aging is winding down their Lackawanna County  
9           Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program, the  
10          coupon opportunity for those with household  
11          income eligibility.

12                    It's all listed on here. The last  
13          two dates -- the next one is going to be July  
14          19th at South Scranton Farmers Market and then  
15          on July 23rd next week at the Scranton Co-op  
16          Farmer's Market, so wonderful event if anybody  
17          does meet the criteria.

18                    RailRiders as we know are winding  
19          down their season. But their camps are still  
20          going on. They have two more, one next week  
21          for those boys and girls that are 6 to 14 years  
22          old, take advantage of some great baseball  
23          instructors and also get to play in a major  
24          league AAA stadium, the Yankees. So great  
25          opportunity there.

1                   The tradition continues. I heard  
2 Chris. Chris is going to talk about it. He's  
3 going to sign up for this is the Lackawanna  
4 County's 3 on 3 basketball tournament. Street  
5 basketball, come on, right? Hoop it up. You  
6 guys would win your division real easy.

7                   MS. BRIER: As long as it's not on  
8 the pavement.

9                   MR. CORDELLI: Unfortunately it is.  
10 All right. It will be Friday, 25th of July,  
11 the 26th with a rain date of Sunday the 27th.  
12 It ranges from boys and girls from 4th grade  
13 all the way up to open division. The cost is  
14 \$25 per person, maximum of five players per  
15 team.

16                   That's a total of \$125. So \$25, you  
17 get to play in at least three games throughout  
18 the weekend. And if you are interested,  
19 Riverfront is hosting and sponsoring the event  
20 as well as taking registration. You can scan  
21 the QR code here and get your teams registered.

22                   This program has been going on for a  
23 year and a half. It is the Pennsylvania  
24 Department of Health free blood lead screening  
25 opportunity for those one year olds to six year

1 olds, with all the chemicals that are going on  
2 in the world with food and everything else.

3 It will give people peace of mind,  
4 your child, a grandchild. All you have to do  
5 is call the number on the list here on the form  
6 to set up an appointment and they are located  
7 at 100 Lackawanna Avenue, Downtown Scranton.  
8 After this month they are stopping that  
9 program.

10 And lastly, our Register of Wills  
11 and Marriage License Bureau is extending their  
12 hours on the last Thursday of each month up to  
13 and through October of this year to go from 4  
14 to 7 to accommodate those who might be working  
15 and not able to get down there for new marriage  
16 licenses or for Real ID.

17 Ladies as we know Real ID is --  
18 everybody, Real ID is a factor. It's a real  
19 deal. And if I may share with everybody a  
20 personal story. My wife had not applied for  
21 her Real ID so we went to get one. So I was  
22 helping her out.

23 Well, when the Department of  
24 Transportation put out the criteria that the  
25 information that we need to get a Real ID, your

1           Social Security number, driver licenses -- I'm  
2           sorry, Social Security, birth certificate,  
3           marriage license if you are married.

4                       So my wife and I -- not to brag, but  
5           we got married last century. Back in the day  
6           marriage licenses weren't this large back then.  
7           They were like this and cut in half and were  
8           kind of lime green.

9                       And we got married Peckville at the  
10          Sacred Heart of Jesus and Father Purcell, the  
11          signature on it was blue and you could feel the  
12          raised imprint, embossed. So we brought that.

13                      We thought got everything we need to  
14          go and get her new Real ID. Well, she pulls it  
15          out. And the lady said, that's not good. We  
16          said you didn't even feel it. It's a real one,  
17          no, no, no. What do we need? She said you  
18          need to go down to Lackawanna County and get a  
19          county marriage license.

20                      MS. BRIER: Oh, not from the church.

21                      MR. LOUGHNEY: You can't have a  
22          raised seal. You should have known that, Mark.

23                      MR. CORDELLI: They didn't specify  
24          that. You're right, Nibs. Silly me, brain  
25          fog. I'm just trying to help to make it easier

1           for everybody else.

2                   MS. BRIER: Mark, I just got mine.  
3           I didn't need my marriage license. I had  
4           Social Security. I had a passport. Maybe the  
5           passport and a bill from my house.

6                   MR. LOUGHNEY: Right, you need a  
7           bill.

8                   MS. BRIER: And my old license. I  
9           thought -- again, I got married in the last  
10          century -- over -- half a century ago. And we  
11          were eloping to DC. And I tried five times to  
12          get it from DC and they wouldn't. They just  
13          ignored me. So I don't have a marriage  
14          license. Maybe I'm not married.

15                  MR. CORDELLI: I didn't hear a word.  
16          Thank you.

17                  MS. BRIER: Thanks, Mark. Thanks so  
18          much for coming and doing this for us. We  
19          really appreciate it.

20                  MS. OVEN: Thank you.

21                  MS. BRIER: Thank you.

22                  MR. LOUGHNEY: Thank you.

23                  MS. BRIER: Anyone else want to  
24          address Council tonight?

25                  MR. WOLFF: Number 13, public

1 officials. I have nothing.

2 ATTY. PERRY: I don't have anything.

3 MAYOR CONWAY: I have nothing.

4 MR. LOUGHNEY: I just mentioned to  
5 Greg before but I will mention it again. The  
6 O'Neill Highway in front of the new Big Lots  
7 and stuff, that thing is so overgrown. It's  
8 terrible. And if you could send PennDOT  
9 something coming off 81 right by the cemetery,  
10 you can't even see the Dunmore sign.

11 It's all overgrown, just when you  
12 are coming into town if that could just be --  
13 and other than, Greg, good job with the alert  
14 system on the 911 situation. It went very well  
15 I guess, right?

16 MR. WOLFF: Yeah, yeah. If you saw  
17 in central Texas, they mentioned the code red.  
18 That is the program we just -- the officer on  
19 scene said can you send a code red alert out.  
20 That's the program that we have.

21 MR. LOUGHNEY: Good job. You got it  
22 going. Thank you. That's it.

23 MR. O'MALLEY: I also wanted to  
24 mention the call system. I have been getting  
25 the alerts, so that's good. It's a positive



1           thing. Do you know how many people are signed  
2           up for it?

3                   MR. WOLFF: Last time I checked, it  
4           was over 300.

5                   MR. O'MALLEY: I think we should try  
6           to do another push to try to get more people  
7           because we got the alert when the garbage was  
8           delayed and that was great.

9                   Also again, I want to thank Miss  
10          McLane and the Junior League of Scranton for  
11          coming. I'll give you my contact information  
12          so we'll be in touch as to what we're going to  
13          do. And really from the bottom of our hearts,  
14          thank you very much. And that's all I have.

15                  MS. BRIER: That's a really lovely  
16          gesture. I have been getting alerts too. So  
17          we know it works and the daily thunderstorms,  
18          you know, you get an alert every day. It's an  
19          unbelievable amount of rain coming. And, you  
20          know, I'm sure those people in Texas didn't  
21          expect that horrible, horrible situation, 26  
22          foot high surge.

23                  And you don't even think that's  
24          possible. And so I think it's a great idea for  
25          us to have that here. And I do also want to

1           thank -- I know we do it a lot but, Tommy, the  
2           Music Fest has been wonderful. So thanks  
3           again.

4                     MR. HALLINAN: Thank you.

5                     MS. OVEN: I don't have anything.

6                     MS. ZANGARDI: I'm good. Everything  
7           they said, they took it all off of me. Thank  
8           you for coming. That's awesome.

9                     MR. HALLINAN: You're going to kill  
10          me. I got about two minutes worth of stuff.

11                    MS. ZANGARDI: Music Fest and, Greg,  
12          thank you for everything, awesome. Thanks.

13                    MR. HALLINAN: I have 170 children  
14          for the parks. Great job, Chris, with  
15          everybody and everything. I just want to give  
16          a shoutout to and make sure it's on the record,  
17          the pizza sponsors this week -- the past week  
18          Danny Donahue.

19                    Next week this Friday will be  
20          DePietro's Pharmacy and Tommy DePietro. And  
21          then week three will be the Holiday Inn and  
22          Corey Pregmon, and week four will be Brian  
23          Loughney Cleaning Service with D Marie's  
24          Consignment Shop. They're going to go  
25          partners, okay.

1                   We had Jeff Charnogursky. He bought  
2                   all the Capri Suns for the whole program. And  
3                   so did Brian and Deanna Leo from Prime Cut  
4                   Landscaping. They bought all the ice pops for  
5                   the whole season.

6                   And that is really nice and I just  
7                   want to say two things about Music Fest. This  
8                   Sunday is -- I hope the weather stays good.  
9                   It's not supposed to so far. But we have a  
10                  fundraiser for St. Joseph's there and to help  
11                  the children out. It will be fantastic.

12                 And we also Jack Culkin from Channel  
13                 16, Mr. Mustache himself will be doing the  
14                 announcing along with the Carmella Mataloni,  
15                 two Channel 16 -- one active and one not,  
16                 personalities helping out for St. Joe's.

17                 MS. BRIER: What time, Tommy?

18                 MR. HALLINAN: 5:00 on Sunday.  
19                 August 17th, I won't be here for this meeting.  
20                 But it's going to be -- and Carmella's great.  
21                 We're going to do a family night at Music Fest.  
22                 So we're going to have EJ the DJ and we're  
23                 going to orientate it towards child with face  
24                 painting.

25                 We're bringing a guy that could tie

1 balloons for the kids. It's a lot of stuff  
2 we're still working on. But I think it's a  
3 great idea. It's something just geared for the  
4 children that night. And that's all I have.  
5 Thank you very much.

6 MR. O'MALLEY: This week it's Pop  
7 and Old Friends?

8 MR. HALLINAN: Yes, Pop and Old  
9 Friends. So it should be a great show. And  
10 then I tried to get Allie there but she --

11 MAYOR CONWAY: We'll be at the  
12 beach.

13 MR. HALLINAN: It's Avalon or Music  
14 Fest. I can't believe she picked that one.

15 MS. BRIER: We'll catch her for  
16 sure.

17 MR. HALLINAN: That's all I have.  
18 Thank you.

19 MS. BRIER: Thanks, Tom.

20 MR. WOLFF: Just need a motion to  
21 adjourn.

22 MR. LOUGHNEY: So moved.

23 MS. ZANGARDI: Second.

24 MS. BRIER: Motion and second. All  
25 those in favor?

1 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.  
2 MS. BRIER: Opposed?  
3 (No response.)  
4 MS. BRIER: Thanks, everybody.
