So it's 12 just basically a driveway. So no one else --13 it's not in use in any way, shape, or form 14 other than to the Eibachs at 120 Harrison 15 Avenue. 16 MS. BRIER: Anyone else on the 17 question? All those in favor? 18 ALL MEMBERS: Aye. 19 MS. BRIER: Opposed. 20 (No response.) 21 MR. WOLFF: Number 13, Treasurer 22 Report, Mark. 23 MR. BURTON: Good evening, Council. 24 Here's a brief analysis for the month of July. 25 Our net income for the month was \$205,000,

which brings our year-to-date net income to 2.3 million.

As far as income is concerned, our rental registration fees are finally kicking in. We had \$16,000 in initial collections.

And Mike and Faith worked pretty hard to get the program up and rolling.

Our special assessments, \$686,000 second quarter landfill fee. Expensewise, our employee benefits were reduced to \$58,000 due to 2025 premium audit refund of 170,000. Participant recreation, 10K for summer program salaries.

Retirement and pension \$50,000 partial MMO payment. And insurance premiums, \$75,000 for our auto liability premium quarterly installment of --

MS. BRIER: Mark, that is our last installment for the health insurance this year?

Do we anticipate another one?

MR. BURTON: The health insurance?

MS. BRIER: No, the 107, the rebate.

MR. BURTON: Oh, that was a refund from the premium --

MS. BRIER: Right.

1 MR. BURTON: Because we made a 2 substantial down payment. 3 MS. BRIER: Yeah, we overpaid. 4 MR. BURTON: We overpaid. 5 MS. BRIER: But it's only the one-time thing? 6 7 MR. BURTON: It was one time. MS. BRIER: And I just had a quick 8 9 question about what is BCW? Commonwealth of 10 Pennsylvania, BCW, 500 bucks. 11 MR. BURTON: Some sort of annual fee 12 or subscription, one of those. 13 MS. BRIER: Okay. Anyone on the 14 question? Oh, wait, there is no question. 15 Thanks, Mark. 16 MR. O'MALLEY: Thank you. 17 MS. BRIER: Thanks so much. 18 MR. WOLFF: Mr. Kearney. 19 MR. KEARNEY: In the past month 20 we've continued with party rentals in this room 21 virtually every weekend. We wrapped up the Summer Program Friday, August 1st and a big 22 23 thank you to Mr. Hallinan who arranged for 24 sponsors to donate for our pizza Fridays along

with providing drinks and freeze pops.

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Also, Mr. Hallinan arranged for the Fidelity Bank Ice Cream Truck to provide ice cream for the last day. Thanks again for all of his help.

We continue with grade school preseason practices in the gym as they get ready for their fall basketball season. The Night Out Program is going to be back here tomorrow night. I was in touch with Sergeant Richardson today getting some details. So that's it.

MS. BRIER: Thanks, Chris.

MR. O'MALLEY: Thank you.

MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you.

MR. WOLFF: Mr. Judge is absent today. Chief Marchese.

CHIEF MARCHESE: Calls for service for July, during the month of July we responded to 1,027 calls for service. This number is just down 19 calls from the previous month.

Arrests for the month, we had 12 criminal arrests, 19 non traffic, 67 traffic arrests, 15 written traffic warnings and 71 verbal traffic warnings.

Part-time Officer Fazio completed

his background checks and is currently going through the on-the-job training process. We had seven shifts go out for overtime for the month. Part timers worked a total of 451 hours.

Officer Burgette took part in his monthly SWAT training on July 8th. All our officers have now completed the Path Finder training and are currently up and running.

From the start of the year to the end of July we've collected, \$6,391 including coin and credit card pay by phone transactions. For the month of July we collected \$160 in parking tickets and three citations were sent down for failure to pay.

Three new meters to be installed in and around the new Bucktown Center. These were taken down during the construction process.

The station was outfitted with all modern computers. We are now fully up and running as a donation we received.

All officers assisted with traffic control and crowd control at several Bucktown Music Fests. And all officers assisted with the yearly fireworks display at Sherwood Park.

And also, our three police cars are at the upfitter right now.

So we're looking at maybe one to two months total to have them in service with them being upfitted and decalled and everything like that.

MS. BRIER: They're brand new.

CHIEF MARCHESE: Yes. And also, our National Night Out is tomorrow as everybody knows. And 5:30 we line up and 6:30 we leave. Thank you.

ALL MEMBERS: Thanks, Chief.

MR. WOLFF: Chief DeNaples.

CHIEF DENAPLES: Good evening,

Council. As far as for expenditures for the month of August, the highest expenditure before we start outfitting our new firefighters with gear and equipment was \$2,286.27.

The command vehicle went in for state inspection/oil change in order for it to pass inspection. It needed some exhaust work. So that was taken care of last week. And that is currently back in service.

Tomorrow we start the process of getting some equipment and stuff together in

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rotations for our new firefighters. We will probably most likely be renting gear to send Jacob to the academy.

And then once he completes that, we could move forward like we did with our last full-time firefighter to purchase new gear and order it so we make sure everything is in line with that.

As far as overtime for the month of August when this report was prepared on August 1st, there was 384 hours of overtime put out, scheduled. As far as part-time shifts for the month of August when this report was prepared, it was 43 shifts.

As far as events with the fire department will be participating in and scheduled in August, we're going to be participating in the Police Department's National Night Out tomorrow, the parade as well.

We're going to do an auto extrication demonstration back here. We spoke with Sergeant Richardson regarding that. As far as calls for the month of July, these calls reflect July 1st to July 31st -- 4 fire calls,

24 rescue and emergency medical services type calls, 6 hazardous material type calls, service calls was 15, good intent was 4, false alarms and false calls category was 19, special type incidents was 3. And the total for the month ended up with 75 total calls. So that is all I have for my report if there is no questions.

MR. DEMPSEY: Chief, just a question for you. I don't know if anybody reached out to you. But the last few years you guys have been good enough to station a truck at the Junior bucks games on Sunday when they are home.

I think usually they're like three games, just for the safety of the kids. They don't have the money to send an ambulance or anything and sit there. Would you guys be open to that again?

CHIEF DENAPLES: Yes, someone actually reached out to Lieutenant Shigo who does the scheduling. And the apparatus was down there yesterday. So there's a schedule posted and all the officers were made aware of that.

MR. DEMPSEY: Fantastic. Thank you

very much.

CHIEF DENAPLES: No problem.

MS. BRIER: Thank you, Chief.

MR. O'MALLEY: Thanks, Chief.

MS. ZANGARDI: Thank you, Chief.

MR. WOLFF: Number 15, public

Avenue. The reason I'm here, the house
directly across the street from me at 1109
North Irving Avenue has been condemned for
several years now. And I just want to find out
what the status is. It was supposed to be on
the demolition list.

MR. WOLFF: It was. I could update you on that actually. We just discussed it. Solicitor Perry gave us some guidance on that last week I think it was. And they did -- it was on the demolition list last year.

They said it was a sales agreement that they had but it's obviously not worked out. And they sent us multiple one. They said, oh, yeah, we're going to buy it, someone else is going to buy it. So they held it off a little bit.

We're done holding it off. We sent out a letter late last week saying we're tearing it down in 30 days. Will it get done in 30 days, probably not because -- well, depending on the cost we may or may not have to put it out to bid.

But they have 30 days. So hopefully in the next 60 days or so that building --

MR. GIORDANO: It's been pending for a long time. The back of the house I went and took pictures this afternoon. One section of wall from one of the rooms completely fell off. The rain gutter came down and reattached and then finally came down.

The tarp on the roof, I've been picking up parts of the tarp for the longest time that are blowing all over.

MR. WOLFF: Yeah, they ran out of chances. Like I said, Solicitor Perry said you
