

## LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE is hereby given that the Dunmore Borough Civil Service Commission has approved the scheduling of civil service exams for creation of a certified list of applicants for an entry level position within the Fire Department as follows:

-July 11, 2026, 10:00am at the Dunmore School District: Physical Fitness Exams (Entry Level – Fire)

-July 25, 2026, 9:00am at Dunmore Community Center: Written Exams (Entry Level – Fire)

-August 8, 2026, 9:00am at Dunmore Community Center: Oral Examinations (Entry Level – Fire)

### Entry Level Qualifications – Fire Department

At the time of application, every applicant for an entry level position in the Fire Department shall possess the following qualifications:

1. Possess a diploma from an accredited high school or a graduate equivalency diploma (GED).
2. Be a United States Citizen.
3. Be physically and mentally fit to perform the full duties of a Full-Time Firefighter for the Dunmore Borough Fire Department as determined by the physical and psychological testing.
4. Possess a valid motor vehicle operator's license and be eligible to legally operate a motor vehicle in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
5. All applicants must be twenty-one years old, or a maximum of thirty-eight (38) years old, on the date of the written examination pursuant to Section 3.4 of the fire rules and regulations.
6. All applicants will have to possess all other mandated training and educational requirements of a Full-Time Firefighter for the Dunmore Borough Fire Department as determined by both the Dunmore Borough Fire Department and Dunmore Borough Council.

All Full-Time Firefighters employed after January 1, 2023 must prove residency in the Borough of Dunmore within fifteen (15) months of his/her commencement to active duty with the Borough as a Full-Time Firefighter. For residency, Dunmore Borough Council, at its sole discretion, may consider an employee's request to extend that period for establishing residency by up to six (6) additional months for a total of twenty (21) months overall.

Entry level physical agility test shall be gender/age neutral and conducted in accordance with the following Physical Agility requirements:

1. Quarter Mile: Applicant is required to run a distance of one quarter mile on a measured course in 110 seconds (one minute fifty seconds or less).
2. Stretcher Carry: will be paired off and required to lift and carry a stretcher with a simulated patient weighing approximately 180 pounds over a distance of 100 feet. Those applicants failing on the first attempt will be allowed to retake the exercise with an applicant who has successfully completed the exercise.
3. Body Drag: An applicant is required to remove a simulated motor vehicle operator weighing 180 pounds, from behind the steering wheel of a motor vehicle and drag the simulated operator to a point of 50 feet from the vehicle.
4. Aerial Ladder Climb: An applicant must wear a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) provided by the Borough, mount an aerial ladder fire apparatus, climb the aerial ladder to a height of 105 feet, and descend the ladder, dismount the apparatus, remove the SCBA, pre-evolution instructions will be given to the applicant and all activities must be performed in a safe manner. (Applicant is not required to be in air).
5. Ladder Raise: An applicant shall remove a 24-foot extension ladder from the provided fire apparatus. The applicant must carry the ladder a distance of 50 feet to a building and raise the ladder to full extension. The applicant must carry a bundle consisting of 100 feet of 1¼ inch hose to the roof line and then back to the ground. Pre-evolution instructions will be given to the applicant and all activities must be performed in a safe manner.

Note: 100% successful completion of all of the above listed is required.

Preference points will be available to applicants who are veterans, EMT certified and part-time applicants. Proof shall be provided upon application. The cost of the entry level application and testing process shall be borne by the individual applicants. Checks should be submitted with the application and made payable to Dunmore Borough in the amount of \$100.00. Entry Level Applications are available at the Dunmore Borough Building, 400 S. Blakely Street, Dunmore, Pennsylvania, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Applications must be completed and submitted no later than June 19, 2026.
